**HAWAII TAKES MUCH FREIGHT FROM COAST**

"Hawaii came within less than \$70,000 of Japan in goods shipped from San Francisco in the month of March," said O. A. Bierbach, secretary of the merchants' association, this afternoon. "That shows that Hawaii figures rather considerably in the trade of California. Here are the shipments to Hawaii and the near Orient from San Francisco for March: To Japan \$2,037,519 To Hawaii 1,968,814 To China 774,786 To the Philippines 519,392 "It is doubtful if the shipments to Japan will continue in the same proportion after the passage of the anti-alien land bill. The figures for April and May, which I will obtain, will be interesting for comparison."

**ADVERTISING MAN IS HERE FROM MAINLAND**

C. Vere Hodge, advertising manager of the Peck-Judah Company arrived this morning on the *Wilhelmina*, and is making his headquarters at the Alexander Young Hotel. Mr. Hodge states that the Peck-Judah Company have extended their operations on the coast, and have lately opened an information bureau in Denver, having leased space in the Denver Sightseeing Company's offices, which company carries a large number of tourists during the season and which is peculiarly adapted for a bureau. They have also placed cabinets for the distribution of literature in that city, Salt Lake City, Colorado Springs and Manitou. The Peck-Judah Company now maintain information bureaus in the five largest cities west of Chicago and they are being used more extensively each year by the traveling public. A great deal of information has been given inquirers on the islands, and the literature has been moving more rapidly during the past 12 months than ever before. Mr. Hodge states that no doubt the islands have felt the benefit of this, in the increased amount of tourists during the past twelve months. One of the new cabinet locations in Salt Lake City is in the Mormon Tabernacle information bureau, which is visited by over 200,000 tourists annually. Mr. Hodge states that the people of Denver and Salt Lake are greatly interested in the Hawaiian islands, and the literature on the islands is moving very rapidly.

**L. C. KENNEDY WILL NOT WITHDRAW FROM CHURCH**

HILO, Hawaii, May 12.—An official business meeting of the First Foreign Church of Hilo was held immediately after the morning service Sunday, May 11, in accordance with the notices previously made public from the pulpit and local press. Deacon F. S. Lyman presided and first called for any unfinished business. The clerk of the church, L. C. Lyman, then presented a letter from C. C. Kennedy, accompanying an amended copy of the resolution considered by the church at a meeting one week previous and withdrawing his resignation.

The withdrawal of Mr. Kennedy's resignation, conditioned on the adoption of the resolution as amended, appeared satisfactory to the congregation, and on motion of E. N. Holmes, seconded by Mr. Scott, the resolution was unanimously adopted. Miss Josephine Deyo arose and expressed the general sentiment of appreciation of the valued services of J. A. Scott as a trustee of the church and the deep regret felt by all at his resignation, at the same time offering a motion that it be not accepted. This was promptly seconded by Miss Harriet Hitchcock and unanimously passed. Upon this Scott arose to state his appreciation of the kindly sentiment thus voiced and forthwith withdrew his resignation.

The chairman then announced that the principal business of the meeting was to hear the report of the supply committee and to take action upon the calling of a regular pastor. The committee reported and recommended that the church extend a call to the Rev. Dr. Cull of San Francisco, at a salary of \$2000. After a clear understanding had been reached as to the power of the church and society relative to the calling of a pastor, Mr. C. C. Kennedy moved that the call be extended to Dr. Cull as recommended by the committee for one year. This was seconded by R. T. Forrest, Dr. Wetmore moved an amendment to the motion, namely, that the rules be suspended and that the clerk be instructed to cast the ballot for Dr. Cull in behalf of the church. It was seconded by Mr. Scott and unanimously passed. The original motion also passed unanimously.

In accordance with the bylaws the result of this election was presented to the society for ratification. On motion of A. Lindsay, seconded by Mr. Kennedy, the society, by unanimous vote endorsed the action of the church in the choice of a pastor and affixing the salary at \$2000, with parsonage granted free. Dr. Cull was then declared duly elected. Mr. Scott offered a motion, which was seconded by Mr. Kennedy, that Messrs. F. S. Lyman and E. N. Holmes be appointed to wait on Dr. Cull and present the request of the church, securing his services if possible. The meeting then adjourned sine die.

Dr. Cull has been unofficially advised of the action of the church and has the matter under consideration. Hilo could well congratulate herself upon securing the services of such a man and it is undoubtedly the man and his message that has induced the call from this church. Dr. Cull is 39 years old. His preaching is characterized by spiritual fervor supported by able scholarship and pleasing presence. His general bearing is such as causes one to see the truth of the gospel message before one discovers the man, which is the highest recommendation for a Christian minister.

Dr. Cull and his gracious wife, coming here as entire strangers, have in the few short weeks of their sojourn in Hilo won the highest respect and confidence of the people thus far met. Dr. Cull is a Californian by nativity, while Mrs. Cull is of New England origin.

**LOS ANGELES MERCHANTS OPPOSE FREE SUGAR**

LOS ANGELES, Cal.—The Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce has unanimously passed a resolution denouncing free sugar as a ruinous attack prompted by the refiners. The resolution states: "They (the refiners) expect that a material reduction in the existing tariff will check the further development of the beet sugar business, and cripple some of the establishments that have come into existence under present protective conditions."
