## OVER-NIGHT FEDERAL WIRELESS To the Advertiser

"For eighteen months the Panama canal has been ready for passage of warships, should an emergency have arisen great enough to require the immediate presence of warships on the Pacific Coast," is the statement made today by Jas. Arthurs, a sub-engineer of the canal who is visiting Regina.

"To send them through would have been a risky undertaking," said Arthurs, "but it could be done with twenty-four hours' notice. The canal could be flooded deep enough for any of our dreadnoughts to pass through."

Opposing a boycott of California and particularly of the Panama-Pacific Exposition, which is being freely agitated in Tokio, the Bankers' Association, by Baron Shibusawa, its chairman, and the Tokio chamber of commerce have started an agitation to send the finest possible exhibit from Japan to San Francisco.

Hon. Buyei Nakano, president of the chamber of commerce, is also arranging a conference of chambers of commerce from all over Japan to fight the boycott idea.

The government has not yet indicated its attitude towards the rival propagandas.

An alleged plot to assassinate Governor Hatfield of West Virginia was uncovered today in the arrest of Lee Carpenter, a miner, at Charleston. A warrant for Carpenter's arrest was sworn out by Mrs. Carpenter, who charges that her husband threatened to kill her if she revealed an alleged plan to kill the governor and others endeavoring to bring about an adjustment of coal strike troubles.

Fears that Aviator Harry Atwood had perished today in a flight from Amherstburg across Lake Erie to Sandusky, Ohio, were allayed only when, after a long search, the aviator was located at Ecobee, Michigan.

Atwood, who left Amherstburg at eleven o'clock, found he was unable to raise his hydroplane off the water. He traveled several miles on the surface of the Detroit river, but finally was stranded near the little Michigan town.

Following a twenty-four hour battle, the federal garrison at Matamoras, Mexico, at five o'clock this morning surrendered to General Lycio Blanco, the Maderista commander. General Blanco immediately opened the port and invited American physicians to cross the boundary and attend the wounded. Surgeons returning from the front report heavy losses on both sides, but no definite estimates were obtained. Many bodies were found.

Dismo Denegi, former assemblyman, testified today in the Esola police graft in San Francisco, that Michael Gallo, convicted bunco man, gave him \$185 to hand to Detective Esola, and that Esola had sent him twenty-five percent of what he had secured or get out of town. He also testified that he had been threatened over the telephone not to testify in the case.

Michael Goslinsky, twenty-two years old, was electrocuted today in Auburn, N. Y., prison. Three contacts were required before life was pronounced extinct. Goslinsky killed Policeman Geo. Cious in Buffalo.

Announcement of the resignation of the Hungarian cabinet was made at the opening of the sitting of the chamber of deputies today by Premier Ladislaws von Lukacs.

Ten thousand Canadian-Pacific railroad shop employes, covering the eastern division, are to receive ten per cent increase in wages next Monday.

Alex Scott, editor of the Weekly Issue, a Socialist publication of Paterson, N. J., has been convicted of aiding and abetting hostilities to the city government in connection with the strike of the Paterson silk workers. When he was indicted the report from the jury recommended mercy.

The body of Prof. Benj. Gibson, a student in the Teachers' College of Columbia University, was recovered at New York today in the Harlem river after he had been missing ten days. A watch and a diamond stick pin are missing, causing some of his friends to believe he was murdered. There are no marks on the body and the police believe it to be a case of suicide.

By a majority of 9026 votes, Police Judge Henry M. Rose is elected mayor of Los Angeles today over John W. Shenk, "good government" candidate.

Mayor Rolph announced that he will call a conference with the police commissioners, Chief of Police White and Captain of Detectives Mooney this week and decide upon some action that will prevent a recurrence of the police conditions revealed by the bunco graft trial and will place the police department on a sound, efficient basis.
