

Resolved, that a sidewalk shall be constructed and curbed within the area described as follows: Upon the established lines abutting on and adjoining the property of King Street, lying between Kapalama Stream Bridge and the Military Reservation of Kahauliki, in the District of Honolulu, City and County of Honolulu, Territory of Hawaii, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 53 of the Revised Laws of Hawaii, as amended by Act 13 of the Session Laws of 1911, and with the provisions of the Ordinances of the City and County of Honolulu.

That the owner or owners of premises abutting on, or adjoining said street, be and are hereby ordered to construct and curb the said sidewalk, as provided by law. That the Clerk of the City and County of Honolulu is hereby ordered to give written notice hereof to said owner or owners, as required by law.
