OVER-NIGHT FEDERAL WIRELESS To the Advertiser

Miss Claire Simson's request for a jury of women was denied today when she was placed on trial in the police court at Tucson, Arizona, for wearing an X-ray gown and the magistrate who tried her instead, acquitted her because he could not determine whether pink tights with the gown were as immodest as black. Miss Simson wore pink tights.

Her defense was that they were not at all improper as the black tights generally employed by wearers of X-ray gowns, which contrasted sharply with diaphanous draperies and were frankly revelatory.

The court ruled that he was not an arbiter of dress and discharged the defendant. Disappointed over his inability to marry on account of his youth, Oscar Gray, aged eighteen years, today shot and killed Ida Lee, aged eighteen years, and then killed himself. Both were pupils at a high school at Salem, Oregon.

Francis Burton Harrison recently appointed governor general to the Philippine Islands, arrived with his wife and four children in San Francisco today en route for the Islands. They will sail Wednesday on the Manchuria.

The hope that the new department of labor may become a department of "industrial diplomacy" which shall induce employers and employees to settle their differences around the council table, was expressed by Secretary of Labor Wilson, the principal speaker at a special labor service at the First Baptist Church in Washington last night.

Asserting that labor organizations under present conditions are absolutely necessary, the secretary contended that they had done more than any other agency outside of the church itself to better the conditions of humanity.

Republican leaders in the senate today refused to agree with Democratic leaders on a day to vote on the tariff bill and the prospect of sending the bill to conference is slight.

Three lengthy speeches by Senators La Follette, Randall and Brewster are yet to be delivered and inheritance amendments presented by Senator Norris will bring forth further discussion.

John Lewis Smith of Washington, D. C., has been elected by the United States War Veterans, in convention at Buffalo, as commander-in-chief for the ensuing term, while the vote of the delegates to hold the next annual convention at Louisville, Kentucky.
