

BIJOU THEATER

With the consummation of this church organization, the present Kalihi Settlement organization will pass out of existence. As before reported, the Rev. Horace Wright Chamberlain, superintendent of the settlement for the past several years, will be pastor of the new church. The Council is also holding a session this afternoon.

The Settlement recently acquired a splendid property on King street between Gulick avenue and Kamehameha IV. road, on which it is hoped before long to erect a handsome church building. For the present, however, the church will make use of the settlement building near the poi factory. It is possible that this building may be moved to the new lot.


