[By Latest Mail] NEW YORK.—Ten miles in 50 minutes 51.35 seconds was the contribution of Hannes Kolehmainen to Father Time when he won the running championship of America at that distance on November 1, breaking the best previous performance of 53 minutes 24.45 seconds and incidentally breaking and creating twenty-seven records at intermediate distances from three and a half miles up to and inclusive of the 10-mile route.

Plans Made for Big Gathering at Punahou on Wednesday Evening, Nov. 26


