HIS HONOR COMES TO AID OF LOWLY COWS WITH BRILLIANT IDEA

Mayor J. J. Fern cut the Gordian knot last night--but not the cow's tail. It may be true that he even saved the tail of the cow at the public meeting on the proposed milk ordinance held by the board of supervisors last night. One of the sections in this ordinance provides that the tails of cows shall be clipped, the object being to prevent them touching the ground, thus avoiding a possible contamination of the milk in that way. "Take a pull and tie it on cow's tail--then you don't have to cut tail off," spoke his honor as he rose to put in a good word for the animal ranking next to the pig in his devotion. "I've milked cow for three years, so I know. No use to cut off tail. Add no use to make your wife come out and hold tail while you milk. Just tie a pull on cow's tail; then no plitkia." The section to which His Honor made his suggestion reads: "All long hairs about the udder of milch cows must be clipped, and the tails of cows must be kept so clipped as to clear the ground." "No use," volunteered the mayor, "to cut the tail off." Someone in the audience suggested that in place of using a bucket, a knot be tied on the cow's tail; but that idea didn't take nearly so well as his honor's. Of course, if the cow happened to be large and fierce, a few bricks could be put in the bucket when the cow is being milked. The supervisors didn't act definitely on his suggestion. They may some other time. They contented themselves last night with smiling, and probably mentally picturing a herd of be-bucketed cows winding "slowly o'er the lea."

WORTHINGTON RECITAL

Everyone is deeply interested in the program to be given on the evening of December 2nd, as it is the last time that the public will be able to hear this talented singer for some years. A much more varied entertainment is promised than at her former concert and some artists new to the music-loving public will make their appearance. ATTY-GEN. THAYER CORRECTS A FALSE REPORT FROM PRISON

Rumors that a number of prisoners in the territorial bastille are languishing beyond their allotted time because there is no governor to sign the necessary papers for their discharge are declared by Attorney-general Thayer to be groundless. Any who have served their full time are released automatically by law, he says. But the majority of those released are let out on parole after they have served the minimum time under the indeterminate sentence statute, and it is over this situation the misunderstanding has arisen. As a matter of fact, says the attorney-general, only one application for parole which seems to warrant early attention is pending, and in that case some doubt has arisen as to the desirability of the action. Under the indeterminate sentence act, the governor may release a prisoner on parole with the advice and consent of the warden and the attorney-general. The one case of the kind now pending involves a man sentenced from Hilo, and High Sheriff Henry has informed Thayer that the man has served five other sentences at Oahu prison since 1899. The attorney-general will investigate the case further, but as yet is not ready to recommend the man's parole. "The prisoners have the somewhat erroneous impression," said Attorney-general Thayer, "that when they are sentenced to a term of not less than a certain number of months or years, they are entitled to parole immediately on the expiration of the minimum term. Such is not the case. They may be held for any additional length of time up to the maximum term set by the court. Their release at an earlier period depends entirely on their behavior in prison, their previous record and, perhaps the nature of their crime."


