

HONOLULU IRON WORKS' NEW BUILDING WILL BE TURNED OVER TO OWNERS FEBRUARY 1, 1914

Under the supervision of C. E. Forbes of the Spalding Construction Company, the handsome new combination office and warehouse of the Honolulu Iron Works, fronting on Queen, Smith and Martin streets, is rapidly nearing completion and will be turned over to the owners on February 1, 1914, per contract schedule. Built entirely of reinforced concrete and being fireproof throughout, the structure is 159 feet wide and 165 feet long and four stories high. The building is the heaviest of its type in the territory, being designed on a scale of 350 pounds to the square inch. The four floors will be connected by large electric freight elevators, three in number, while the material housed in the structure will be handled with traveling cranes, electric hoists, and the Lamson system of carriers. One of the distinct features of the building is the perfect lighting facilities, there being a series of huge windows for each floor, arranged in such a manner that they may be opened to admit air. Through a complete electric system, the building will be amply lighted at night. At the beginning of the construction, considerable difficulty was experienced in the footings of the building, owing to the heavy weight of the structure, but the problem was solved by bringing into play concrete reinforced with steel. The lavatories throughout the building are equipped with the latest appliances finished in marble. Space on the first floor 50 feet wide and 165 feet long will be devoted to the storage of steel, the floor in this section being paved with ohia blocks set in a concrete base. This room was one of the first to be constructed, and has been used by the company since the building was commenced. At present there are 135 men on the job. The forward end of the second floor will be given over to the offices of the company to take the place of those now located on Nuuanu street. These will be fitted with new equipment, and may be reached either by stair or by elevator.

HAWAII HOCHI HAS PRAISE FOR GOVERNOR PINKHAM; WILL SUPPORT THE INCOMING ADMINISTRATION

The following from the editorial columns of the Hawaii Hochi demonstrates the fact that Governor Pinkham will have the able support of that paper:
 Delay after delay, being noisy about the objections against the nomination, the confirmation by the senate was a hard thing to be got, but at least on the day before yesterday, the nomination of Mr. L. E. Pinkham as governor of the territory was finally confirmed.
 From the first, we knew of his personality as well as his ability, and had expected that the nomination would be confirmed sooner or later, and getting the report of the confirmation, we have no words to express the joy we have in our hearts. Looking from the standpoint of the territorial administration, Mr. Peary, the retiring governor had gone to the mainland, and Mr. Mott-Smith, the acting governor, has also gone to the mainland, and there have been some complaints of delayed administration. Suppose, unfortunately, Mr. Pinkham was not confirmed, and the new candidate is searched after, it would not be likely the governorship could be decided before the close of the session of Congress, which would lead another delay of the administration, and consequent losses to the territory; this is why we are glad of the confirmation of the nomination.
 There have been diverse explanations of his personality as well as his ability, but as to our idea, such must be premature and hasty judgment, as we shall see his ability on his actual administration, while as to his personality, it could be admitted that there must have been some changes in the course of the past few years. And suppose that he has some defects, after his sitting on the governor's chair, the sense of responsibility shall lead him to be very careful, that need not to be feared, while as to his conduct versus Japanese some years ago, deliberate judgment makes us think that that was the result of his faithfulness to his duty.
 Judging from his quick decision of things, clearness of his head, thorough knowledge of the territory of Hawaii, we think we could expect of him a good administration. Moreover, he belongs to the progressive party to which Mr. Lane, secretary of the Interior, also belongs, who has

PERSIA WANTS TO TAKE PART IN BIG SHOW

Sends Word That Her Envoy Will Soon Be Here to Select Site

SAN FRANCISCO—Mirza Ali-Kuli Khan, charge d'affaires of the imperial legation of Persia, writes President Moore of the Panama-Pacific Exposition as follows:
 "I have the honor to advise you that I have received instructions by cable from my government to proceed to San Francisco to select land for the Persian section at the Panama-Pacific International Exposition, to be held in 1915 in that city, and I expect to leave for California on November 9, 1913."
 This is gratifying news to the exposition, as up to the present time Persia had not accepted the invitation to participate. This makes the twenty-eighth foreign nation to declare its intention to take part in the coming exposition.

JAPAN REPORTED TO BE SEEKING NEW ALIEN TERMS

WASHINGTON, D. C.—Surprise was shown at the state department at the report from Tokyo that another note regarding the California anti-alien land legislation had been despatched to Washington. The last Japanese note remains unanswered. It was supposed negotiations temporarily would be held in abeyance until the return of Counselor John Bassett Moore from his vacation. Mr. Moore returned to Washington on Wednesday.
 It is reported here that the Japanese government has reached the conclusion that it can not meet the contention of the state department that the California land law is not in conflict with the existing treaty and has decided to seek a new convention.
 Unofficial information from Japan indicates that Japan is inclined to ask for an agreement that will in conventional terms recognize the right of Japanese land ownership in any state of the United States on even terms with the citizens of any other nation.

BRAZIL NEEDS NEW RAILWAY COACHES

RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil—The Brazilian government is asking bids for railroad equipment. Three companies have thus far submitted their figures. The cars are to be used on the Western railway of Minas.
