REINECKE DIVORCE DECREE SET ASIDE BY JUDGE WHITNEY

Circuit Judge Whitney this morning granted Mrs. Annie Anderson Reinecke's motion and set aside the decree of divorce granted her husband, Albert Reinecke on November 25. The wife accused her husband of trickery in obtaining the decree, averring that he had not only agreed to withdraw his divorce petition but had later declared he had done so, and continued residing with her, at the same time preventing her from receiving notice of the hearing and finally astounding her on the morning of November 25 by walking into the house and announcing the decree had been granted.

'MISS' HUNTER-JONES ASKS FOR A DIVORCE

Mrs. Beryl Spiegel-Greyloch, better known in Honolulu as Miss Beryl Hunter-Jones has filed suit in circuit court for a divorce from Edward F. Spiegel-Greyloch, to whom she asserts she was married at Los Angeles on June 19, 1911.

The couple have not resided together in the territory and she alleges the husband is now located at Dallas, Texas. Judge Whitney issued an order this morning authorizing the service of the divorce libel on him by the sheriff of Dallas county and set the date of the divorce hearing for 9 o'clock on the morning of February 10. The suit is based on the ground of non-support.

Though making occasional trips to the coast Mrs. Spiegel-Greyloch has apparently made her home with her mother, Mrs. M. M. Hunter-Jones, teacher and healer of the Home of Truth, located at 1220 Kapiolani street. BEFORE THE SUEZ CANAL.

Since the P. and O. began its career in 1837 by running boats from London to Lisbon, it has had only one serious crisis to face, and that crisis brought it to the mills of its rivals. It arose out of the completion of the Suez canal. The P. and O. before that waterway drew the world's fleets to India, had enjoyed a monopoly, and a delightful old-world monopoly it was. You took ship to Alexandria down the Mahmoudieh canal, to the Nile, and so to Cairo. And now began the excitement. A hundred miles of desert had to be crossed, and you crossed them in an omnibus! Sometimes 3000 camels were needed to shift

a ship's cargo from the Mediterranean to the Red Sea.

When the canal was finished, all this huge machinery became useless. The directors were slow to scrap their camels and their omnibuses, and came perilously near ruin before accepting the canal as a blessing. To Sir Thomas Sutherland the credit is due of adapting the great fleet to modern conditions. The first P. and O. steamship, the William Fawcett, was 200

tons and 60 horsepower. Now the common type runs to 10,500 tons and 15,000 horsepower.—From the London Chronicle.






