### COMMERCIAL ITEMS.

Pacific Fishing Company, of which Dr. K. Haida is president and M. Yamashiro treasurer, declared a dividend of 10 per cent at the end of the year. The event was celebrated with a banquet at the Tokiwa Club on Nuuanu street.

A. Hocking is going to erect a 3-story business block on King street, adjoining the clubhouse of the United Chinese Society. It will cost \$42,500 and the contractor is K. Matsu-moto.

S. M. Damon, head of Bisoap & Co.'s bank, is quoted as saying money is plentiful in Hawaii but long time loans are not being made. Cecil Brown, president of the First National Bank, is reported as stating that quarterly interest payments have been very satisfactory.

Byron O. Clark, who came here with the California colony that placed Waiawa on the pineapple map, is returning at 59 years of age to that state, having bought eighty acres of fruit land near Paradise, Butte county, on which he will grow English walnuts. Mr. Clark has done a great deal to advance diversified agriculture in Hawaii, both in private enterprise and as commissioner of agriculture. His departure is to be regretted.

NEW YORK. — The last of the Christmas mails for foreign lands left New York on the 17th. All told, foreigners in New York City sent 496,898 money orders, aggregating \$7,775,000 to the folks at home. To Great Britain went \$2,000,000, to Italy \$1,667,000; to Russia nearly \$800,000, and to 16 other countries sums dwindling to \$1068 in the case of Liberia, recipient of the smallest amount.

## FRONTAGE TAX TO BE INVOKED FOR IMPROVEMENTS

An important policy for street work, important in connection with the movement for street improvements under the direct frontage tax, was agreed upon by the roads committee at a special meeting held by it with L. M. Whitehouse, city and county engineer, late Saturday afternoon.  
Under this new policy no street improvement work will be undertaken out of the \$10,000 a month appropriation for Honolulu's highways. That entire sum, or as much of it as used, will go for street maintenance only. This agreement opens up the way for the application of the frontage tax laws, and shows that the committee is determined to try out these new statutes thoroughly.  
Under the agreement reached Saturday, if road improving is to be done, it must be accomplished under the frontage tax statutes, unless the work can be considered under the head of mere maintenance.  
In making up the last budget, the supervisors set aside certain sums for road work in different districts; for Honolulu it was \$10,000. In the other districts it was less. The meeting Saturday afternoon was to decide upon what policy this money should be disbursed. The decision reached is one highly satisfactory to those who have engaged in the campaign for street improvements under the frontage tax.

## TOM GUNN WILL MAKE DRAMATIC DIVE SUNDAY

"Many names have been added to the world's list of aviator loop-the-loops recently and it is getting to be the most thrilling performance by humanity in the world. Why, it will be but a short time when all flying machines will be built to the specification of doing the loop, as the modern automobile with self starter and electric gear shift," says Tom Gunn.  
"Several days ago I received a letter from Lincoln Beachey, with whom I was a teammate in the season of 1912, and he is now recognized as the first American loopster. He was on his way to Washington in response to a message appointing conference with Secretary of the Navy, Daniels and Secretary of War Garrison.  
"Beachey, after flying upside down 31 times, looped the loop, as the phrase goes, first at North Island, San Diego, Cal., Nov. 25. Since then he has looped the loop all through the state of California. Beachey used a 24-foot wide Curtiss biplane fitted with an eight-cylinder 100-110 h. p. Curtiss motor. The machine is said to have covered the mile course of a circular dirt track at a speed of 88 to 89 miles per hour. Describing his stunt, he said: "I did not fall over in a somersault as I figured on doing in the latter part of 1912, but actually climbed straight up over the point down, describing an oval which is about 100 feet in width. I made one loop when about 300 feet from ground. The machine is tremendous fast for a biplane and that is why it is responsive to the slightest touch of the controls. The device I use for strapping in is of automatic hooks and heavy leather straps and at one motion it would unbuckle.  
"I recommend a powerful motor and extra strength is needed for places where the heavy strains take place."  
Although Tom is not contemplating doing the loops at Pearl City next Sunday, he has promised to do many stunts which will give the local public many thrills till the loopers are common to these islands. Tom is a work putting special bracing to his hydroaeroplane, with which he figures on doing a dive from a great height.  
Many other water events will take place, such as yacht races, motorboat races, swimming and canoe contests, etc., etc.
