## FLORIDA NOW ENTERING THE POI INDUSTRY

Help! Florida is trying to steal Hawaii's poi industry. Well, they are trying to raise taro there anyway; and Dr. E. V. Wilcox, agent in charge of the federal experiment station, gives that fact as an alarm, and incidentally shows what a good thing the taro game is. There is good money in raising taro, and there is an ever-increasing demand for it.

"Is Hawaii letting the taro business slip out of its hands?" asks Dr. Wilcox. "It's the wrong time to fall asleep at the poi vat, for there is a bit of interest in taro just now. We have too much land doing nothing but lying idly on its back, looking up into the face of the sun and waiting for the hoe. Upland taro would help to keep busy some of this great army of unemployed land. Yields of 15 tons per acre at \$25 per ton are worth considering, even if farming makes no other appeal than that of money."

"Down in Florida the people are taking an amateur interest in taro. They have imported varieties from all parts of the world. They are even making poi. How would it seem to have a Florida 'cracker' come here to give us pointers on poi?"

"If Hawaii raises more taro than is needed for home use, it can be dried and shipped to the mainland. W. A. Priest, 304 Milk street, Boston, Mass., wants taro flour or any kind of dried taro product. The size of his want-department is ten tons per week. F. C. Little, advertising manager of the Literary Digest, 1219 Peoples' Gas building, Chicago, says he had a dyspepsia-grouch for years until he filled his opu with taro. Now his Mona Lisa taro smile won't come off. It's infectious and rapidly spreading. Mr. Little says that if some one will put up a clean, honest taro flour or dried taro product, he can advertise it in such a way as to make the betts 100 to one against some of the shrewd sawdust breakfast foods, and in favor of taro."

## ARMY ORDERS

Following are abstracts of recent army orders from the Hawaiian Department:

Corporal Owen R. Rhoads, Company G, 1st Infantry, Schofield Barracks, H. T., will report on January 16, 1914, to the president of the board of officers at Schofield Barracks for preliminary examination by the board to determine his fitness for appointment to the grade of 2nd lieutenant in the army.

Private Anthony Pasco, Troop I, 4th Cavalry, Schofield Barracks, will be discharged from the army by the commanding officer of that post by purchase.

Captain George S. Gibbs, signal corps, department signal officer, will proceed to Fort Ruger, De Rusey, Armstrong and Kamehameha for the purpose of making annual inspection and test of the entire signal corps equipment of those posts.

Upon arrival in this city, Sergeant 1st class Lewis D. Harp, hospital corps, will proceed to the department hospital, reporting on arrival to the commanding officer, for duty.

In compliance with General Orders No. 131, war department, September 25, 1911, a board of officers as hereinafter constituted, is appointed to meet at 10 o'clock a. m., on Friday, January 16, 1914, at Schofield Barracks, H. T., for the preliminary examination of such enlisted men as may be ordered before the board to determine their eligibility for the final examination for appointment to the grade of 2nd lieutenant in the United States army. The examination will be conducted under such instructions as may be furnished from these headquarters. The junior member of the board other than a medical officer will act as recorder thereof.
