question of discipline certainly is a very simple one here. The children are all courteous and wherever I have gone I have seen nothing but well-behaved children. The character of the teachers—one of the essentials which must always be looked out for—is most excellent. I do not believe I have ever seen a more perfect physical drill by pupils than I witnessed at the school at Ewa. The sight of the children of many nationalities saluting the American flag was inspiring beyond words.

In comparing the schools of Honolulu with those of his own city, Mr. Steele pointed out two facts: first, in Gallesburg there are no private schools with the exception of an academy. Every family in that city sends its children to the public schools as a matter of course. Second, he pointed out that in Honolulu but two per cent of the entire enrollment is in the high school, while in Gallesburg 20 per cent of the pupils enrolled are attending high school.

"Those persons on the mainland who knock the schools of Hawaii certainly have never been here to learn the true conditions," he said in conclusion. Mr. Steele and his daughter will remain in Honolulu until March 20, at which time they will return to the mainland. In the meantime they plan to visit the other islands and the volcano.

DETAILS OF ARMY BILL AS IT WAS PASSED IN HOUSE

[By Latest Mail]

WASHINGTON.—The Army appropriation bill which passed the House today contains a clause, inserted by Representative Kahn, as chairman of the National Defense League, which gives the War Department authority to issue to civilian rifle clubs 334,000 Krag-Jorgensen rifles, now stored in arsenals. With each rifle 200 rounds of ammunition per annum are to be issued.

California rifle clubs can obtain the guns by applying to the War Department, as the senate undoubtedly will allow Kahn's clause to remain in the bill.

The bill contains \$125,000 for the Presidio of San Francisco.

Naval Bill Reported.

The naval appropriation bill, carrying \$129,964,333 for two battle-ships, six torpedo boat destroyers and other craft, was reported to the house. The two battle-ships are to cost \$15,000,000 each and will be built at private yards by contract.

A minority report filed by Representatives Buchanan, Gray Hensley and Witherspoon denounced the naval increase appropriations as "useless expenditures, inexcusable extravagance and criminal waste of the public funds." The report asserted that there is no need for more battle-ships.

Provisions Of The Bill.

The bill contains a provision authorizing twenty-five appointments from the enlisted men of the Navy to the United States, with two years' enlisted service, and selected by competitive examination.

The bill prohibits the purchase of any armament, articles or materials which the navy yards and gun factories are equipped to supply, unless these government plants are operated for not less than one regular shift each working day, except in certain cases. It increases the corps of chaplains in the Navy from twenty-five to fifty-two and grants citizenship to any eligible alien who serves a four-year enlistment.

Discussing the Pearl Harbor dry dock, whose limit of cost is increased to \$4,985,500, the committee reports that the construction of the dry dock under the first plans was fraught with great hazard and inadvisable.
