PAAUHAU SUGAR CO.
MEETS ON COAST AND NAMES DIRECTORATE

[By Latest Mail]
SAN FRANCISCO.—At the annual meeting of the stockholders of the Paauhau Sugar Plantation Company, held March 7, 8,905 1/3 of a total of 100,000 shares of the outstanding stock were represented, and the following officers were elected:

President, William Matson; first vice-president, Henry St. Goar; second vice-president, A. F. Morrison; secretary-treasurer, H. W. Thomas. The directors elected were William Matson, Henry St. Goar, A. F. Morrison, Charles Templeton Crocker, John A. Buck, R. R. Strange and Charles P. Hanlon.

The situation, as explained to the stockholders, was contained in a statement that sugar sold in New York on Friday on a basis of 3.91 for 96 degree centrifugal, which would net the company \$48.70 per ton, less than the cost of production.

The report states that the production for the year 1913 was satisfactory, but that the price, netting \$57.37 per ton, was altogether disappointing. The price received in 1912 was \$71.65 per ton, and in consequence the company reported a net loss of \$23,446, the first in its 15 years of operation. Vice-president St. Goar's report states that the prospect of a remunerative price for the 1914 crop is not good; that the estimated world's production is the largest ever made and that there must be expected the 25 per cent tariff cut.

The report of Alexander Smith showed that 2769 acres in 1913 yielded an average of 2.5957 tons per acre and estimated the 1914 crop at 10,000 tons from 2607 acres. The 1915 crop looks promising and a heavier rainfall is expected.
