**Cold-Storage Fish**

An investigation conducted in the  
biochemical laboratory of Columbia  
University at the College of Physi-  
cians and Surgeons, New York City,  
shows that there is no depreciation in  
the nutritive value, or any change in  
the sanitary character of the fish  
during two years of cold storage. Con-  
vincing as these studies are of the ex-  
cellent possibilities of preserving  
fresh fish by the freezing process,  
they must not be allowed to disguise  
the fact, says the Journal of the Amer-  
ican Medical Association, that they  
do not give a clean bill of health to  
animal tissues removed from cold  
storage and exposed until sold or even  
kept in a common refrigerator. Net-  
her can spoiled food be adequately  
preserved by any method. It is un-  
fortunate that the efficiency of useful  
processes is sometimes impugned by  
unjustifiable applications of it. This  
has been true of cold storage.

**Chinese Thrifty Farmers**

"In the utilization of every square  
foot of soil and every leaf or root that  
is grown thereon, the patient, hard-  
working farmers of China could give  
points even to the thrifty rural popu-  
lation of France," says the Philadel-

**WILLETT & GRAY**  
**SUGAR REPORT**

Willett & Gray of March 19 has the  
following report on sugar:  
STATISTICS BY SPECIAL CA-  
BLES. — Cuba: The six principal  
ports:  
Receipts, 78,000 tons; exports, 37,  
000; stock, 401,000 tons, against 284,  
000 tons last year.  
Centrals grinding, 174 against 174  
last week, 174 last year and 172 in  
1913.  
Entire Island receipts for week,  
117,000 tons, against 116,000 tons last  
week, 106,000 tons last year and 87,  
000 tons in 1912.  
Stocks in the United States and  
Cuba together of 705,752 tons, against  
653,253 tons last week and 515,350  
tons last year, an increase of 190,402  
tons from last year.  
Europe: Stock in Europe, 3,423,000  
tons, against 3,423,000 tons last year.  
VISIBLE SUPPLY.—Total stock of  
Europe and America, 4,127,752 tons  
against 3,938,350 tons last year at the  
same uneven dates. The increase of  
stock is 189,402 tons against an in-  
crease of 185,048 tons last week. Total  
stocks and afloats together show a  
visible supply of 4,282,752 tons  
against 4,064,350 tons last year, or an  
increase of 218,402 tons.  
RAWS.—Centrifugals were quoted  
at the close last week at 1 15-16c c. &  
f. or 2 9-16c per lb. duty paid for 96 deg.  
test.  
The following day, Friday, 1 32c per  
lb. advance was paid for prompt ship-  
ment at 1 31-32c c. & f. (2.98c) and 2c  
c. & f. (3.01c) was paid by refiners  
for April shipments (100,000 bags al-  
together).  
The market strengthened on these  
purchases and sellers withdrew for 2c  
c. & f. for any shipment and held firm  
without selling until the Tuesday Cuba  
cable came in which was considered  
unfavorable for further immediate im-  
provement. Also, on this day, there  
was a semi-demoralization in the re-  
fined sugar market, caused by ac-  
cumulation of some refiners to sell ac-  
cumulated surplus production. Sellers  
of raws renewed offerings at 1 31-32c  
c. & f. (2.98c), on Wednesday, for  
prompt and March shipment, and on  
this day the American accepted all  
such offerings on the market to ex-  
tent of 250,000,000 bags, leaving the  
total firm at this basis.  
Today, owing to an increased de-  
mand for refined sugar, which demand  
had the effect of improving the entire  
sugar situation, the American entered  
the market and purchased some 100,  
000 bags April shipment at 2c c. & f.  
(3.01c). These purchases were fol-  
lowed by other sales for both prompt and  
April shipment at 2c c. & f. (3.01c),  
various refiners participating, an in-  
totaling some 350,000 bags.  
The Cuba cable of Tuesday gave  
weekly receipts for entire island the  
largest of the crop thus far, 117,000  
tons, with the full 174 Centrals work-  
ing and continuing fine weather. The  
visible crop to March 14th is 1,149,352  
tons; against 998,603 tons to corre-  
sponding date last year, and giving  
promise of full-up crop to estimate.  
European markets for beet sugar  
have been moving within 3/4d. fluctua-  
tions for the week, opening at 9s.  
0 1/4d. and ending at 9s. 1 1/4d. for pre-  
sent month. Futures for May opened  
and closed at 9s. 2 1/4d.  
F. O. Licht cabled the weather un-  
favorable for field work on Friday  
and Tuesday.  
Further business between Cuba and  
the United Kingdom is reported on  
basis of 1.90c per lb. f. o. b. Cuba.  
Crop news from Porto Rico and Ha-  
waii is favorable, with dry weather  
for grinding.  
We increase our San Domingo crop  
estimate 20,000 tons, the only change  
made in our world's crop estimates.  
Atlantic ports receipts for week are  
large—73,742 tons. Stocks increased  
11,742 tons to 163,894 tons, about the  
same stock as last year—159,879 tons.  
Stocks in Cuba are larger than last  
year by about 185,000 tons for entire  
island.
