ASSOCIATED CHARITIES NOT ABLE TO HANDLE NEW CASES AT PRESENT

Lack of Funds Necessitates Plan of Retrenchment for Few Days at Least

For the present time, or for several days at least, the Associated Charities can give no more relief to new cases. The increasing number of applicants noticeable during the past week and the marked depression in the organization's funds, due to giving temporarily relief to them, has made this step necessary. It was reported yesterday afternoon that the charities' funds have become so low that the amount of food orders for families now have been reduced from an average of \$1.50 a week to 88 cents a week. A dollar and a half a week is the minimum upon which a family of five can live, it has been ascertained, and, as a result of this cut, in a great many cases starvation will begin, say the officers of the charities.
 "In the wake of starvation sickness is sure to follow; we already have begun to see signs of it," said Manager Spencer Bowen. "In his annual report to the supervisors, City and County Physician Wayson prophesied a 50 per cent increase in illness in the years 1914 and 1915. And it begins to look as if his prophecy is going to come true."
 "This will mean an additional expenditure to the city and county of Honolulu for the year 1914 for hospital cases alone of \$7500, in spite of the fact that retrenchment is taking place in the city and county and that it now is considerably in debt."
 The association can handle no more new cases for it only has sufficient money on hand to care for the cases already under its jurisdiction; and secondly, there is not the office force to do it. It has been found impossible to keep the records necessary, and to do the necessary work of investigation.
