### BY AUTHORITY. ORDINANCE NO. 58.

AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF GRADES AND SIDEWALK LINES ON PARK, LAIMI AND PUIWA STREETS, IN THE DISTRICT OF HONOLULU, CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU, TERRITORY OF HAWAII.

Be it Ordained by the People of the City and County of Honolulu: Section 1. Grades, Datum Plane. That the grades of Park, Laimi and Puiwa Streets, in the District of Honolulu, City and County of Honolulu, Territory of Hawaii, being portion of Nuuanu Valley, as hereinafter set forth, are established in reference to a datum plane being mean tide at said district of Honolulu and being located as follows, to-wit:

A bench mark at the foot of pillar at the left entrance of the Judiciary Building in said District of Honolulu, is 16.5 feet above said datum plane. Said grades are above said datum plane, the distance specified on a map which is on file in the office of the City and County Engineer of the City and County of Honolulu, and is marked Grade Map No. 9.

Section 2. The sidewalk lines of said Park, Laimi and Puiwa Streets, shall be parallel with, and the distance shown from the following described center lines on the aforesaid Grade Map No. 9.

Park Road: Commencing at a point in the center of Park Street at the intersection of the makai side of Puiwa Street with an Azimuth of 329° 49' and distance of 190.2 feet from the Government Survey Street Monument in Puiwa Street, said monument being North 260.8 feet and East 1415.2 feet from Government Survey Trig. Station "Rosebank" thence by true Azimuth: 1. 49° 53' 15.2 feet;

2. 26° 02' 49.8 feet;

3. 50° 32' 12.4 feet;

4. 57° 29' 20.2 feet, to the point of a curve.

5. Thence curving to the right with a radius of 287.9 feet; direct azimuth and distance being 74° 57' 17.8 feet, to the point of tangent.

6. 92° 25' 296.3 feet to point of curve to the left;

radius of 287.9 feet, the direct azimuth and distance being 78° 10' 140.9 feet to the point of tangent;

8. 63° 55' 261.9 feet to a pipe near the easterly line of Laimi Street;

9. Thence curving to the right to Laimi street and containing approximately an acre of land.

Laimi Road: Commencing at a point which marks the proposed center line intersection of Laimi Street with the south curb line of Nuuanu Avenue, the co-ordinates of which are, as referred to the Government Triangulation Survey Station "Rosebank": North 1987.7 feet and East 130.0 feet; and running as follows by true Azimuths:

1. 308° 39' 44.0 feet; Thence on a curve to the left having a radius of 64.8 feet and direct bearing and distance being

2. 278° 30' 64.9 feet; Thence

3. 248° 25' 228.0 feet;

Commencing at a point which marks the proposed center line intersection of Puiwa Street and the south curb line of Nuuanu Avenue, the co-ordinates of which are, as referred to the Government Triangulation Survey Station "Rosebank": North 3067.5 feet, and East 1112.9 feet; and running as follows by true Azimuths:

1. 334° 18' 205.0 feet;

2. 328° 50' 157.0 feet;

3. 320° 26' 188.0 feet;

4. 323° 59' 185.0 feet to the north-westerly line of Park Street.

All streets, avenues and roadways not specially described in this ordinance, as well as the grades and details of the curb lines, shall be in accordance with drawings on file in the office of the City and County Engineer, City and County of Honolulu, Marked Grade Map No. 9, which is hereby approved and made a part of this ordinance.

### SUFFRAGETTES ARE PLANNING GREATLY ENLARGED CAMPAIGN

LONDON.—The Women's Social and Political Union has issued its eighth annual report showing increased expenditures for the year of \$15,000, which it is said was due to "greatly multiplied and heightened activities." The increase in income of more than \$40,000 leaves a balance for the year of something over \$200,000. The total year's income is said to have been considerably over \$200,000. The press department which publishes the suffragette and other educational literature including Christabel Pankhurst's "great scourge," turned over more than \$55,000.

The projects for the immediate future are announced to be a special effort to increase the circulation of "The Suffragette," the sending of a deputation to the king in May, a great money-raising effort and a self-denial week.
