MISCHA ELMAN CAPTIVATES LOCAL AUDIENCE WITH MELODY OF VIOLIN

Russian Musical Genius Will Be Heard in Second Concert Tomorrow Night

Mischa Elman, master violinist, received the welcome and hearty approval last evening of the people of Honolulu. The large, enthusiastic audience admired, enjoyed, and finally embraced the young musician who for two hours made them forget time, place—everything but the wonderful, all-pervading melody of his playing. There is only one word in the English language which may be used in describing him and that is "genius."

which he smilingly threw around his neck, intensifying the applause until at last he responded with Gossec's delightful "Gavotte," which won him more warm approval.

His last number was Sarasate's tremendous "Zigeunerweisen," which showed his masterful technique most brilliantly. It was truly wonderful and at its close the audience refused to allow him to retire. The applause was deafening and continued until he consented to give one more selection. It was a genuine tribute of appreciation to Mr. Elman and his art.

The violinist's interpretations were for the most part original, that is peculiar to himself, expressing his own delightful versions, and these with his unassuming and pleasing manner, have already endeared him to the hearts of Honolulu people. Mr. Percy B. Kahn was most successful in adding to the perfectness of the program by his artistic piano accompaniments, which were cleverly subordinated to the work of the violinist.

All those who enjoyed last night's concert and those who were unable to attend are eagerly anticipating Saturday night's program, which is to be as follows: Concerto in E Minor... Mendelssohn; Faust Fantasy... Wieniawski; (a) Nocturne in E Flat... Chopin; (b) Minuet in D... Haydn; (c) Air on G string... Bach; (d) Sicilienne et Rigaudon... Couperin-Kreisler; (a) Air... Pargolesi; (b) Donde des Lutins... Buxini S. P.

The next four short selections were lovely. The Schubert-Wilhelm "Ave Maria" seemed the outpourings of the musician's very soul, and the pathos and vibrating tenderness of the notes brought sympathetic tears to many eyes. The Schumann-Auer "Vogel als Prophet" and Beethoven's "Minuet in G" were both wondrously light and delicate. The "Hungarian Dance No. 7" by Brahms and Joachim, was weird and pleasing. At the end of these selections, Mr. Elman was given a tremendous ovation, perhaps the most enthusiastic ever accorded an artist in these islands. He was also presented with a number of leis.
