MUSHROOMS ARE THE LATEST CULTURE

Special Star-Bulletin Correspondent H.I.L.O., July 3.—E. E. "Dooney" Hartman, one of the famous Waimea homesteaders, has discovered a new Hawaiian industry, according to the story brought in by Superintendent H. W. Kinney of the department of education who visited the Hartman home early this week in the course of his tour of inspection among the Big Island schools. The industry is mushroom cultivation.

Superintendent Kinney says, as a matter of fact, "Dooney" doesn't appear to do much cultivating, simply going out into his pasture and gathering the delectable comestibles.

"They are real mushrooms all right," says Kinney. "I know, because I ate some, and I'm still alive. So they can't be toadstools, and they certainly were delicious.

"Put the thing I can't understand," he adds, "is how Dooney finds the energy to pick them when they are right ripe, as you might say. You know mushrooms, to be caught at their best, must be plucked just as they are spreading out the umbrella-like frame, and they do that at night or very early morning. To get a goodly mess, one must simply camp out all night with both eyes open and the moment he spots one opening up he has to grab it, right then and no later; otherwise it's overripe.

"How Dooney does it I don't know; he must lose a lot of sleep." All of which reveals, not only what may be accomplished by a humble, though persevering homesteader, but to what unsuspected depths the erudition of our new superintendent extends.

SAY CANAL SLIDES CHECKED.

PANAMA.—Although the rainy season has been on for more than a month, the saturation of the earth has not increased the Cucuracha slide which the dredges have been racing to overcome. It is estimated that the dirt is now being removed twice as fast as it slides in the channel, and that a level of rest for the slide may soon be reached. The depth of the channel is now over 38 feet and with a width of more than 200 feet it was more than sufficient to accommodate the Panama Railroad Steamship Alliance, of 4000 tons, which was the first ocean liner to pass through the canal, without mishap. Even a 10,000-ton ship would have no difficulty, but the canal is not yet ready for the bigger warships.
