



IN WRECK-STREWN SEAS MONGOLIA PROCEEDED

Ploughing through the waters strewn with wreckage, the voyage of the big Pacific Mail liner Mongolia in the famous and picturesque inland sea of Japan was one filled with stirring incidents in which a series of gallant rescues were effected by Captain Emory Rice and his officers.

The Mongolia, which was berthed at Pier 7 late Saturday afternoon, was delayed at Nagasaki, Japan, through quarantine. It is reported that plague has made serious ravages in many ports throughout the Orient.

Leaving the vessel at Honolulu were four cabin, four second class and 82 Asiatic steerage passengers.

Proceeding to San Francisco when the vessel sailed at noon yesterday were 91 cabin passengers booked at the local agency of H. Hackfeld & Co.

Believe Niagara Nearing Port. Bearing a distinguished party of wealthy mainlanders, including Joseph Letter, the Chicago multi-millionaire, the fine power yacht Niagara, at one time the property of George Gould, is steaming across the Pacific and in the direction of Honolulu, according to a report brought to this city with the arrival of the Pacific Mail liner Mongolia.

The yacht and party have been cruising over the world for more than one year, much time having been spent in Indian and China waters. It is predicted that the yacht may arrive here by the latter part of the week. Considerable mail for members of the party has been received in this city and is now awaiting a claimant at the office of the Hawaii Promotion Committee.

Destined for the several island ports and scheduled to sail at 5 o'clock this evening, the Inter-Island steamer Claudine is on the berth to sail for Maui ports. The likelihood for windward Kaula and the W. G. Hall for Ahukini and Nawiliwili.

HARBOR NOTES

The British freighter Strathdon, laden with lumber for Australia, will be supplied with a quantity of coal before departing from this port this afternoon.

Sailing from Hilo with a full shipment of island sugar the American-Hawaiian freighter Virginian passed and was reported from Pernambuco on last Thursday.

The Inter-Island steamer Kinau is numbered with the vessels scheduled to sail at 5 o'clock tomorrow evening, this vessel taking passengers and cargo for Kaula ports.

Taking a quantity of sugar and molasses destined for the coast, the Matsun steamer Manoa has returned from Kahului and Kaanapali, Maui. The vessel will complete a cargo destined for coast refineries at Honolulu.

Remaining at this port since July 9, at which time a shipment of lumber was brought from Fort Bragg, the schooner W. F. Jewett was dispatched late Saturday afternoon for Puget Sound. The vessel was supplied with 5 quantity of ballast.

The departure of the Pacific Mail liner Mongolia set for Sunday noon, drew out a large throng of spectators. Pier 7 was the scene of a merry gathering. About 100 passengers departed for San Francisco in this vessel.

The local agency for the American-Hawaiian line has been advised that the freighter Columbian with 11,500 tons of sugar supplied at several island ports, and dispatched from Hilo for the east coast of the United States on June 15, was sighted and passed Cape Virginia on last Thursday.

With 85 cabin and 13 steerage passengers, the Matsun Navigation liner Matsuna from San Francisco is due to berth at Pier 15 at an early hour tomorrow morning. Included in 3500 tons of freight for island ports are a number of automobiles. Mail to the amount of 317 sacks are due to arrive in the Matsuna.

Since resigning his command of the bark Andrew Welch more than a year ago, Captain Edward Kelly, well known at this port in fraternal as well as shipping circles, has been identified with the R. P. Rithet Company as superintendent at Vancouver and Victoria. The bark has been laid up at Oakland creek for many months.

LESLIE RETURNS AFTER QUARTER CENTURY

A visitor to the "Sandwich Islands" in the golden days of a Hawaiian monarchy, Captain James C. Leslie, now master of the trim ocean-going tramp freighter Strathdon, at the port today taking on coal preparatory to resuming a voyage to Sydney and Melbourne, Australia, readily recalled the quaint repose and south-sea island charm characteristic of Honolulu a quarter of a century ago, when, as an officer in a sailing packet he spent some weeks in this city.

The harbor was then filled with towering masts, from which were draped a field of white canvass. The days of the whalers had not entirely passed, and much of the commerce visiting the islands was propelled by sail. Save in an occasional call from a vessel in the oriental or Australian trade, the presence of a steamer was the exception rather than the regular rule.

Captain Leslie admitted today that he saw but few of the familiar landmarks that designated the Honolulu of monarchical days, when passengers and mail were brought from the mainland in a fleet of fast clipper ships, which ran in close competition to small steamers on the San Francisco-Honolulu route.

The Strathdon loaded lumber at Everett, Aberdeen and Seattle, Washington. On board this vessel are more than 3,000,000 feet of the product. To load 350 tons of coal, the Strathdon was diverted to pay a call here. According to the skipper the vessel met with moderate seas and light winds on the voyage from the Sound.

Captain Leslie figured in a series of stirring incidents while with his command steamed in Mexican waters. On several occasions his vessel and officers were targets for the miserable marksmanship of the Mexican rebels. The Strathdon is expected to steam for the south seas today.

MORE STEAMERS IN A.-H. PACIFIC SERVICE

A more frequent service between the islands and the east coast of the United States will be maintained by the American-Hawaiian Steamship Company, during the remainder of the sugar season of 1914, according to advices received in this city Saturday.

Due to the smaller tonnage of vessels of the Georgian, Pennsylvania, Kentuckian and Montanan type, arrangements have been made to send an additional number of these steamers to the Pacific in the Pacific in order that they may take care of the sugar now accumulated at the several island ports.

The steamer Pennsylvania is now at Port Allen where heavy inroads are made in a quantity of sugar collected at Port Allen. The vessel will proceed to Hilo to complete cargo and sail from that port for Delaware Breakwater by the way of Magellan straits. The Pennsylvania has a capacity for about 8500 tons of product.

To facilitate the movement of sugar the Montanan and the Kentuckian are now on the way to the islands. Together these vessels will carry about 17,000 tons of sugar for east coast refineries.
