**FIVE DROWN AS RESULT OF GIRL'S FOOLISH ACTION**

MANCHESTER, N. H.—The attempt of Miss Annie Burtons, a student of the New England conservatory of music in Boston, to climb into a row boat in which were her sister, Mrs. Minnie Mills of South Merrimack, the latter's two children and her younger niece, Dorothy Burtons of Utica, N. Y., caused the drowning of all five. The accident occurred in Naticook Lake in South Merrimack.

The party had gone out for an outing. Miss Burtons was swimming while her sister and the three children rowed slowly about in a flat-bottomed boat. Two brothers of Miss Burtons remained ashore.

When the young woman grasped the stern of the boat and tried to climb in, it went under. The young men on shore reached the scene too late to be of assistance. One of them, Fred Burtons nearly lost his life in trying to locate the bodies.

**FEAR FORESTER MARGOLIN HAS BEEN DROWNED**

Was Well Known in Hawaii, Where he Investigated Eucalypts

Louis Margolin, who made an investigation of eucalypts for the Board of Agriculture and Forestry about 1911, the result being a bulletin entitled "Eucalyptus Culture in Hawaii," would appear to have come to an untimely and tragic end. Ralph S. Hosmer, superintendent of Forestry, in yesterday's mail received a letter from C. S. Judd, a Honolulu man attached to the federal forest service, in which the writer says: "I am very much shocked to read the enclosed in last night's paper and I know that you will be the same. It is too bad, for he was a fine fellow."

The enclosure mentioned was the following San Francisco dispatch of July 2: "A reward of \$1000 has been offered for information concerning the fate of Louis Margolin, a member of the United States forest service, who disappeared in the Sierra national forest June 19. The reward was offered by L. N. Margolin, a hat manufacturer of New York and a brother of the missing man. The forest service also offered \$200 for the recovery of Margolin's body."

"The day Margolin disappeared he had started from a forest ranger camp on Dinkey creek for another camp on Patterson mountain, 12 miles away. Soon afterward a terrific storm broke, and it is feared he was drowned."

Mr. Margolin had a good many friends in this territory from his mission here already mentioned.

**LOCAL OFFICERS GET SOUGHT-AFTER DETAILS TO SERVICE SCHOOLS**

The details for the service schools for next year have just been received at army headquarters. They carry the names of several officers of the local garrison who have been ordered to Leavenworth and Riley.

Captain Varlen D. Dixon, 4th Cavalry, and Captain Herschel Tupes, 1st Infantry, have been detailed to the Army School of the Line.

Captain Samuel Frankenberg and Captain Ned B. Rehkopf, 1st Field Artillery; 1st Lieutenant Seth W. Scoville, 1st Infantry; 2d Lieutenants R. M. Cheney and E. G. Cullum; 4th Cavalry, are detailed to the Mounted Service School, Fort Riley, Kans.

Lieutenant Scoville is one of three officers of the infantry army to get the detail.

The designation of Cullum and Cheney makes a big hole in the 4th Cavalry polo team, both of these officers being stand-by players.

The 4th Cavalry officers gave their annual regimental dinner at Haleiwa last night. There was a complete representation from the regiment and besides the officers of the 4th there were present Major-general W. H. Carter, Lieutenant-colonel J. B. McDonald, 1st Lieut. J. G. Pillow, aide to General Carter, and 2d Lieut. R. D. McDonald, cavalry.
