ROBERTSON IS CANDIDATE FOR LOWER HOUSE

Archie Robertson is a candidate to succeed himself in the house of representatives. His formal announcement, made yesterday afternoon, says: "Honolulu, T. H., August 7, 1914. "To the Voters of the Fourth Representative District of the Territory of Hawaii: "I beg to announce myself as a candidate for reelection to the house of representatives from the fourth district and shall seek the nomination at the coming primaries on the Democratic ticket. "You honored me with this position two years ago, an honor which I greatly appreciate. I leave myself in your hands and, if my past record has been satisfactory, I ask that you give me a second term. BIG ISLAND TO BE BATTLEFIELD ALL NEXT WEEK

Hawaii promises to be a political hotbed next week. With three candidates for delegate on that island, all on a speech-making campaign, Hawaii will probably have its first touch of real campaigning of the season.

L. L. McCandless is on Hawaii now. Prince Kuhio is at Lahaina, where he will hold a meeting tonight. He will go from there to Molokai, and after three days spent on Molokai he will start for Hawaii via Lahaina.

Palmer Woods, whose announcement as a candidate for delegate on the Democratic ticket is published in another part of this paper, will leave the middle of the week for Hawaii. So by Thursday the three candidates will be "hoopin' it up" on Hawaii.

THE PHILIPPINE SUGAR GROWERS ARE IN TROUBLE

J. F. Boomer, a correspondent of the department of commerce and labor, says in a recent letter from Manila: "Latest reports from the sugar provinces of Negros and Panay show that the planters are in serious financial straits, owing to the poor quality of the crop this year. The yield is more abundant than that for last year, but the quality is generally poor, and the prices offered are so low that the planters can not meet growing and harvesting obligations. The low grade of sugar turned out is ascribed largely to the antiquated machinery employed in its manufacture. Few modern mills are yet operating in the country, principally because the planters are unable to buy them. It is already apparent that planters must be given government assistance if they are to prepare for the next season's crop. "Replanting time is at hand and the sugar men are at the end of their resources. Loans from the Agricultural bank may relieve the situation somewhat, but cannot save it. In order that a planter may get money from the Agricultural bank he must have good title to his land, which must be unincumbered. As a rule, planters have not clear titles. The new Torrens system of registration introduced into the islands by the present government has not spread widely enough. Few planters have yet had sufficient money or faith in the new system to have their holdings registered, and consequently, by the rules of the Agricultural bank, few titles are acceptable. On the other hand, many haciendas are already incumbered by loans from persons and organizations with whom the old titles were acceptable. "An appeal has been made to the government for some such relief as was extended on a previous occasion, by making money available for loans on the sugar actually on hand or deposited in properly designated warehouses. On the former occasion the money was deposited by the government in the Bank of the Philippine Islands for loan to the sugar men on their harvested crop. It was done to prevent the pinching of the sugar men through forced sales. Through the crop loans replanting was carried on and the sugar was held until the price had gone up and it had become possible to market the crop at a profit rather than at a loss. "Last year \$750,000 was deposited with the bank. The governor-general has announced that this year funds will not be available with any one bank, but that if any of the local banks now designated as government depositories request assistance in financing the sugar crop in Negros and Panay or in any other province, and ask for additional government funds therefor, available funds will be placed at the disposal of these banks, if satisfactory security is offered."
