**JOAQUIN MILLER HOME PURCHASED BY OAKLAND, CAL.**

OAKLAND, Cal.—"For the purchase of 'The Highs,' the former home of Joaquin Miller, \$40,000."

This item will appear in the budget this year for the city of Oakland, and in a short time the beautiful home of the dead poet will belong to Oakland and will be the mecca of thousands who loved his work while he was alive and revere his memory now that he is dead.

The final step in the move to have Oakland acquire the poet's former home in the hills back of the city was taken when a large delegation of women called on Mayor Frank K. Mott and urged that the plan, which emanated from the women of Oakland, be carried out at once, so that "The Highs" could become city property before the opening of the 1915 fair. Mayor Mott promised that he would see that the item appeared in the budget.

"The Highs" will, after the city gets title to it, become a part of the Wildwood chain of parks, a series of beautiful spots that are unique in American cities. The chain consists in all of a little more than 300 acres, and the Joaquin Miller place is one of the links.

"It is not merely a sentimental feeling that prompts the Oakland women to urge the purchase by the city," said the leader of the delegation. "The place is really historic, and it can be bought now for much less than will be the case later.

"The stamp of Joaquin Miller's personality has been placed upon this home, where he lived for more than a quarter of a century. Some of those who live in Oakland may not realize how highly the poet was esteemed by the people of the east and of Europe. We were too near him, possibly, to obtain the proper perspective. We are beginning to see that his old home will be the mecca of many a tourist, and that will be one of the big talking points of Oakland and of California at large.

**OUTRIGGER CLUB WILL HAVE STILL LARGER GROUNDS**

Big Things Are Planned With the Restoration of Property Consumed in Flames

The Outrigger Canoe Club is preparing for big things, the ladies having secured the Faxon Bishop property adjoining. It seems likely that the two organizations will attempt to secure the Seaside grounds when their present leases run out, with its thousand members the club should not find this impossible. Plans are well on foot to throw the two present properties into one and do a great deal of tearing down and rebuilding, already Surveyor Wall has thoroughly surveyed every inch of ground while Emory and Webb are preparing drawings and plans for the new grouping of buildings. The plan in view is to create a real Hawaiian village about the lagoon, with native grass houses in which poi will be pounded by Hawaiians and tapa beaten by those who still remember the art. The caretaker's house, bicycle sheds and other outbuildings will all be Hawaiian and built partly over the waters of the lagoon, the great canoe sheds will extend, Hawaiian style, along the beach, and it is planned to have the bath houses all grouped together about a common suit—drying ground, so that all of the area about the big hau tree lanais may be utilized as a recreation and beauty spot of which Hawaii may well be proud, for with the women's bath houses moved from their present position there will be a vista in one direction from the club grounds of the most attractive cocconut grove in the islands, that of Kamehameha the Great on the Seaside Hotel grounds, the other vista being of the ocean and the surf riders, from under the hau trees. It is proposed to retain the ladies' lanai for the exclusive use of women visiting the grounds, where no smoking will be allowed, no persons in bathing suits, and men only on special invitation. What is now known as the men's lanai will be greatly enlarged and thrown open to the members of both organizations for general use. It is also possible that at the next annual meeting the word "auxiliary" will be dropped by the women's club, as this word has led to many misunderstandings, the women's club not being an auxiliary of the Outrigger Club, but an entirely separate organization, it is likely also with the greatly enlarged facilities that in January the membership of the women's club will be raised from four hundred to five hundred, and it is expected that this will at once wipe out the entire waiting list of would-be members. Everyone at the Outrigger Club is doing team work now to make the Outrigger Club a mighty force in the community.

It may be interesting to know that the Outrigger grounds once belonged to royalty and that here once Princess Emma, afterward queen, came daily with her retinue to go out surfboard riding and canoeing, and that is why the Queen Emma estate so willingly turned over these grounds to the Outrigger Canoe Club on the condition that it would keep alive the old Hawaiian water sports of which the queen was so fond a devotee all her life. The only grass houses, purely Hawaiian, on this island, are those on the Outrigger grounds, one of them actually inhabited at one time by Kamehameha the Fourth and by Queen Emma.
