STOCK EXCHANGE BUSINESS SHOWS ENORMOUS DECLINE FOR THE PAST FIVE DAYS

Five business days this week balance five last week, for the stock exchange record, but in volume of business and trend of prices both, the present week yields a tremendous downfall, due no doubt to the decline in raw sugar on the New York market, which has been 0.96c since Monday's quotation. Hawaiian Sugar Co., 70 shares for \$2835; price 37 1/2, decline 1/2. Hilo Railroad Co., com. 70 shares for \$170; price 2 1/2, unchanged. Honolulu Brewing & Malting Co., 135 shares for \$2285; price 17, gain 1/2. McBryde Sugar Co., 54 1/2 shares for \$2931.87 1/2; high 6 1/2, low 4 1/2, decline 1 1/2. Mutual Telephone Co., 5 shares for \$100; price 20, gain 1/2. Oahu Sugar Co., 713 shares for \$13,833.50; high 19 1/2, low 18, decline 1/2. Olaa Sugar Co., 1625 shares for \$8,903.75; high 6 1/2, low 4 1/2, decline 1 1/2. Onomea Sugar Co., 10 shares for \$220; price 22, decline 1/2. Pala Plantation Co., 30 shares for \$4200; price 140, gain 1/2. Pioneer Mill Co., 75 shares for \$1,887.50; high 25 1/2, low 24 1/2, decline 1 1/2. Waiialua Agricultural Co., 55 shares for \$5625; high 102 1/2, low 100, decline 4. Bonds—Honolulu Gas Co. fives, \$6,500 at 99, unchanged; Oahu Railway & Land Co. fives, \$14,000 at 101, gain 1/2; Oahu Sugar Co. sixes, \$5000 at 99, gain 1/2; Olaa Sugar Co. sixes, \$5000 at 85, unchanged. Several dividend announcements have been made this week. Haiku and Pala each increased their monthly dividends from 50c a share to \$1, beginning October 1. Waiialua will pay \$2 a share on the 15th of October, November and December, respectively, the same as it paid on the 15th of this month. Ewa will pay extra dividends of 40c a share, in addition to its regular dividend of 10c, on the last day of each of the ensuing three months. Dividends amounting to \$128,750 were payable on Monday, being 50c by Alexander & Baldwin, \$25,000; \$2 by Hawaiian Agricultural Co., \$40,000; 75c by Hawaiian Electric Co., \$7500; 75c by Onomea Sugar Co. at San Francisco, \$56,250.
