### HAND-TO-HAND FIGHTING AT SOISSONS

(Associated Press by Marcon Wireless.)

PARIS, France, Oct. 5.—(Official.)—Heavy fighting is taking place at Soissons between the Allies and the Germans.

Several lines of trenches have been taken by the Allies in hand-to-hand fighting, and the Germans are contesting every step of the advance.

### POINCARÉ GOES OUT TO BATTLE FRONT

Advices from Bordeaux say that President Poincaré, accompanied by the premier and the minister of war, left the temporary capital yesterday noon to proceed by automobile to the battle front.

The party will remain several days in the field, visiting the troops for the purpose of encouraging them, and congratulating them upon the bravery they have shown against the enemy and their successes.

### GERMANS MASSING ON DUTCH BORDER

AMSTERDAM, Holland, Oct. 5.—Reports received here are to the effect that German activity is increasing on the Dutch frontier. The Belgian town of Lanaken, in the province of Limburg, has been occupied by the German forces.

### WAR BRINGS RELIGIOUS REVIVAL IN FRANCE

LONDON, Eng., Oct. 5.—The Times is in receipt of advices from its Paris correspondent saying that the war is causing religious revivals in France. The French priests are showing great heroism in the field, as well as laboring unselfishly among the wounded and from the battle fields and the refugees.

The Times expects a similar religious revival in England.

### TURKS OUST ITALIANS FROM AVLONA

AMSTERDAM, Holland, Oct. 5.—It is reported here that the Italian naval contingent which was landed at Avlona, Albania, to prevent the Turks from taking possession of that capital city, has been routed by the Turks with Austrian assistance. If the reports are correct Italy probably will become involved in the war.

### ANTWERP STILL INTACT; HEAVY CASUALTIES

ANTWERP, Belgium, Oct. 5.—It is officially announced that the situation is unchanged. The artillery duel between the forts defending the city and the German siege batteries continues.

All the bridges of the River Nethe have been destroyed by the Belgians, to delay operations from the north.

The Germans have requested a two-hour armistice to bury the dead who were killed in the unsuccessful assaults on the outer line of defenses.

### GERMANY OFFICIALLY SAYS ANTWERP TOTTERING

BERLIN, Germany, Oct. 5.—The government gives out the following official announcement:

"Antwerp forts waver. St. Catherine and Dorpeld forts have been taken.

"Fort Waelhelm is invested.

"Termonde is occupied by our forces.

"The new attempt by the French to turn the western wing of our army has been successfully repulsed, and the French are terribly excited.

"South of Roye and at Toul, sorties by the enemy have been repulsed."

### BALLOON AMERICA SOLD TO BRITAIN

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Oct. 5.—The sale to Great Britain for \$25,000 of the great dirigible balloon America, which was built for an attempt to cross the Atlantic, is reported here. The airship will be used for war purposes.

### GEORG RODIER HEARS OF VICTORIES

Following is the cablegram received by the German consul last night:

"General situation of the German armies in France satisfactory. The reinforced right wing is progressing along the line of Arras, Albert and Roye. The heights at Roye, which are of particular importance, have been taken after terrible battles. The center is unchanged. Through the operations along the River Meuse, two spearheads (outer defenses) were captured.

"The advance of stronger forces through the loop at St. Mihiel was impossible so far, on account of French counter attacks from Toul. The Allies admit, however, that they have sustained enormous losses, and that the German artillery is strongly superior.

"The African troops had to be withdrawn from the field on account of cold weather.

"The fall of Antwerp is imminent. Two forts have already been silenced.

"The situation in the east is continuously favorable. After the Rus-

sians had met with reverses from our army, they were reinforced beyond Niemen and the Bobr rivers. The German army then withdrew for strategic reasons.

"The Russian offensive in Galicia has completely failed up to the present time. The Austrians hold strong positions between the fortresses of Przemyśl and Cracow.

"The total number of prisoners taken by the Germans up to September 12 was 220,000 men, including 4110 officers."

### GERMAN DEFEAT IN EAST PRUSSIA

PETROGRAD, Russia, Oct. 5.—It is officially announced that the battle at Augustova, where the German invasion of Suwalki province was repelled, ended yesterday in the complete defeat of the German army.

The Germans are fleeing along the whole East Prussia front, and are abandoning all the stores and supplies. They have lost all their heavy artillery.

Russian troops are in full pursuit.

### 3000 RUSSIANS TAKEN PRISONERS

AMSTERDAM, Holland, Oct. 5.—It is reported here that the German commander of the fortress of Koenigsberg has announced the capture of 3000 Russian prisoners and 18 big guns in the battles of last Thursday and Friday.

### KHEDIVE OF EGYPT PRISONER OF TURKEY

ROME, Italy, Oct. 5.—A despatch received yesterday from Constantinople says that the khedive of Egypt, who is on a visit to Turkey, is practically a prisoner. The sultan has ordered the khedive not to leave Constantinople without permission.

### PETROGRAD CONFIRMS EAST PRUSSIAN VICTORY

LONDON, Eng., Oct. 4.—Further advices received from Petrograd give details confirming the disaster attending the attempted invasion of Russia by the Germans from East Prussia into the province of Suwalki.

While the official German despatches report a retirement before the reinforced Russia army, on the Niemen river, Petrograd reports that the invaders were routed.

Central News despatches say that whole regiments were drowned in the Niemen river during the retreat and that the Germans lost all their siege artillery.

The German emperor, who was reported to have gone to the front, is said to have escaped with difficulty.

### AUSTRIA MAY MOVE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT

In view of this reverse, and the Russian advance on Cracow, Vienna is preparing for a siege and there is talk of removing the seat of the Austrian government, according to reports received yesterday.

Advices from Rome say that Innsbruck, capital of Tyrol, more than 200 miles southwest of Vienna, near the German border, and directly south of Munich, is mentioned as the place to which the Austrian government probably will remove.

Rome also reports that an endless stream of wounded from Galicia has been pouring into Vienna, and that there is a famine among great numbers of unemployed in Bohemia.

A despatch from German headquarters received in London yesterday says that a portion of the 22d Russian army corps, composed of Siberian troops, was defeated in a two-day battle at Augustova, in the province of Suwalki.

### GENERAL VON TROTHA REPORTED KILLED

From Paris the death of the German lieutenant-general, von Trotha, is affirmed. He was killed in East Prussia.

### MINES WRECK STEAMERS IN NORTH SEA

LONDON, Eng., Oct. 4.—Advices from Ostend to Lloyds say that the British steamship Dawson, bound from Hull for Antwerp, struck a mine in the North sea and was sunk. Nine of the crew are reported missing.

Despatches to the Central News from South Shields say that the Norwegian steamer Truma was wrecked by a North sea mine yesterday morning, two persons being drowned.

### BRITAIN TO COUNTER-MINE

The British admiralty announces that the German tactics of laying mines in the North sea have forced England to adopt similar measures.

Late despatches from Rome to the London Times report that a Roumanian sailing vessel and an Italian steamship have been sunk by mines in the Adriatic sea, with heavy loss of life.

### CZAR GOES TO FRONT

PETROGRAD, Russia, Oct. 4.—It is officially announced that the czar has started for the front and will join the Russian army repelling the German invasion in Suwalki province.

### LONDON SAYS ATTACKS ON ANTWERP FAIL

LONDON, Eng., Oct. 4.—Official advices yesterday by Reuter's Agency say that two German attacks on Antwerp have been repulsed with heavy losses to the attacking forces.


### BLOCKADE RUNNER SUCCESSFUL AT TSINGTAU

LONDON, Eng., Oct. 4.—According to a message from Tientsin to the Despatch yesterday, a Hamburg-American line steamship has run the Japanese naval blockade at Tsingtau, carrying a cargo of ammunition into the besieged city.

### INDIAN TROOPS ON FIRING LINE

### JAPAN TO KEEP GERMAN TARIFF LAW UNREPEALED

(By Latest Mail.)

NEW YORK.—The East and West News Bureau has made public a cable message received from Tokio stating that the Japanese government permits to importers the enjoyment of the German-Japanese commercial treaty

whether their goods were shipped or stored in bonded warehouses before Aug. 23, or are to be shipped or stored in bonded warehouses after the beginning of hostilities, providing the shippers declare that the importation will be made before the end of March, 1915.

The same law allows until July 15, 1915, the maximum limit of exemption to duty certain goods imported into Japan for reshipment abroad. These goods are specified in article 8 of the existing tariff law and were granted

the exemption from duty if exported within one year from the date of importation.

The government allows the time limit for re-exportation, expiring between the dates of Aug. 1, 1914, and July 30, 1915, to be uniformly extended to the end of July, 1915.
