COMMERCIAL NOTES

There is to be no reduction in fares between Honolulu and San Francisco for the exposition.

Experiments to determine if vinegar can be produced from the waste juice of pineapple canneries have given indifferent results.

Dairymen in the Hilo district have received much advantage from the Glenwood sub-station of the Hawaii Agricultural Experiment station.

Building permits have been stuck at municipal headquarters lately.

J. P. Cooke, who returned from the mainland this week, predicts another advance in sugar about the end of the year.

A new fire map of Honolulu from the Sanborn Map Co. will be issued about the first of November.

Sugar in New York yesterday made a recovery to 4.5c from 4.39c, to which it had dropped from 4.52 the day before, and again today receded to 4.39c.

Structural steel for the naval station buildings will arrive in the steamer Hoctor this month from New York. Two submarines for the navy are coming in the same vessel.

Alexander & Baldwin having bought all of W. A. Kinney's stock in McBryde Sugar Co., the suit for accounting brought by him in California against the company will be dropped.

This year's Hawaiian crop of sugar will be a record one of more than 600,000 tons, and with the high prices in the latter part of the shipping campaign its value will be around \$40,000,000.

By the arrival yesterday of the British bark Kinross-shire, 177 days from Hamburg, a crisis in the affairs of the Hawaiian Fertilizer Company was ended. The vessel is loaded with phosphates for the company and had its arrival been much longer delayed the superintendent, Norman Watkins, would have been obliged to go to Australia in search of supplies of the material.

YOKOHAMA BANK
PLANS DIVIDEND
OF 12 PER CENT

A 12 per cent dividend is in store for the stockholders of the Yokohama Specie Bank, according to the report from the head office at Yokohama, September 16. The following statement was made by J. Inouye, chairman to the stockholders:

"The directors submit to you the annexed statement of the liabilities and assets of the bank, and of the profit and loss account for the half-year ended June 30, 1914.

"The gross profits to the bank for the past half-year, including Yen 1,287,888.08 brought forward from last account, amount to Yen 23,012,647.45, of which Yen 19,547,242.25 have been deducted for interests, taxes, current expenses, rebate on bills current, bad and doubtful debts, bonus for officers and clerks, etc., leaving a balance of Yen 3,465,405.20 for appropriation.

"The directors now propose that Yen 350,000 be added to the reserve fund, and recommend a dividend at the rate of 12 per cent per annum, which will absorb Yen 1,800,000.

"The balance, Yen 1,315,405, will be carried forward to the credit of next account."

It is hoped by the harbor commission that contractors bidding on harbor improvements will be willing to accept the new territorial bonds, which Treasurer Conklin has failed to float in New York, in payment of contracts.

The 32-ton sampan Konokiki has been incorporated by Alice C. Macfarlane with a capital of \$5000, she holding 230 shares of the 250 issued at a par value of \$20 each.

The Endau Development Company, with the main purpose of developing a rubber plantation in the state of Johore, Straits Settlements, and with an authorized capital of \$100,000, is being incorporated under the laws of Hawaii. Shares have a par value of \$10 each, and the entire 10,000 of them are taken by L. R. McPhail of Singapore in exchange for 25,000 acres of land in Johore. Headquarters of the company are in Honolulu, and its officers and directors are Albert Waterhouse, president; J. O. Young, first vice president; L. R. McPhail, second vice president; F. T. P. Waterhouse, secretary and treasurer; H. F. Hayward and C. R. Hemenway.

"Cold Storage for Tropical Fruits" is press bulletin No. 47 of the Hawaii Agricultural Experiment Station, the authors being E. V. Wilcox and C. J. Humm. It relates the history of experiments made at the refrigerating department of the Hawaiian Electric Co. with various kinds of fruit in different stages of ripeness, also with fruit flies at certain degrees of temperature. In some cases the results were encouraging, but in others the refrigeration spoiled the fruits. Pickling avocados in salt brine did not spoil the flavor of the fruit when tested on being taken out, but when the fruit was placed in fresh water to extract the salt, afterwards it was found that the flavor was flat and disagreeable.

STOCK EXCHANGE BUSINESS
MAKES SUBSTANTIAL GAIN
DESPITE DROP IN SUGAR

Raw sugar dropped from 4.52c to 4.39c, or a shade over 1/4c the latter part of the past six-day period, and some sugar stocks declined in sympathy. Yet, in some cases, closing prices were higher than just before the period here under review. In the notation below the changes are net, as for instance, the decline in Waiulua occurred in the opening sale and the "high" in that case was for the closing sale. On the whole the results of the week on the stock exchange were decidedly an improvement over those of last week. Fifteen stocks were handled against 14 for the former period, and 5878 shares against 4599, while the proceeds from stocks were \$36,904 as compared with \$20,661.25, or an increase of \$16,242.75. Bonds sold realized \$1830, being \$10,535 less than last week, leaving as the net gain of all proceeds \$15,707.75.

Of 12 sugar stocks sold three gained, six declined and three were unchanged, as compared with last week's quotations prior to Friday's session last week. Three miscellaneous stocks show two gained and one declined. Details of the business follow:

Dividends becoming payable during the period amounted to \$402,500, being as follows: Hutchinson, 15c, or \$15,000; Paauhau, 15c, or \$15,000; Waiulua, \$1.50, or \$45,000; Hawaiian Sugar, \$1.10, or \$165,000; O. R. & L., 65c, or \$32,500; Pepeekeo, 53c, or \$26,500; Waiulua, 52c, or \$50,000; Oahu Sugar, 10c, or \$25,000; Kekaha, 50c, or \$7500. C. Brewer & Co. announced an increase in its monthly dividend from \$1 to \$2 for the remainder of the year, beginning October 31, and Alexander & Baldwin an increase from 60c to 75c, beginning October 20, with an extra dividend of 75c the same date.
