**GOOD REPORTS FROM WATERHOUSE RUBBER ESTATES LAST MONTH**

Favorable news has been received by the Waterhouse Co., Ltd., regarding its rubber estates in the Malay States, in a letter from Singapore cabled from Manila. In September the Tanjong Olok plantation yielded 18,700 pounds of rubber, bringing the production to the end of that month up to 141,438 pounds, compared with 100,901 pounds for the first nine months of last year. Pahang in September yielded 18,500 pounds, making 133,570 pounds to the end of that month against \$8,020 pounds for the corresponding period last year. That of Tanjong Olok is the largest yield for any month since the plantation started.

On October 15 prices in Singapore jumped 7 cents to 47 cents, yet Fred T. P. Waterhouse says their contract for 29 cents to October 31 had proved advantageous, as it enabled them to sell their product since the war depression began at about the ruling market price. Both plantations have kept going at a slight margin above cost.

**SOLDIERS FACE**  
**DEATH IN OCEAN**  
**NEAR HALEIWA**

SCHOFIELD BARRACKS, Oct. 26.

Last Thursday the beach two miles east of the Haleiwa hotel was the scene of a dangerous and daring rescue which has resulted in three members of the 1st Infantry being recommended for a certificate of merit. These men are Private Lewis M. Miller, Co. M, and Private James J. Dicks, Co. K, and one other soldier whose identity several investigations have failed to disclose.

A large number of soldiers were in bathing and romping in the surf. The breakers were rolling in strong and high, and few dared to go more than a few feet from shore. Private Charles L. Armstrong of Co. I, 1st Infantry, a very strong swimmer, fought his way out about 75 yards, and found that he was unable to get back. His calls for help brought hundreds to the shore who saw Armstrong's efforts become weaker and weaker, and finally it was seldom that he came to the surface though his body could be seen under the clear water in the wake of every breaker.

Two men with powerful strokes swam out to his rescue. One was Private James J. Dicks, but who the other was no one has yet been able to find out. If a swimmer as famed as Armstrong could not fight his way back to shore, what chance had they? They reached Armstrong and together brought him to the surface and held him there for what seemed an interminable period, with heavy waves breaking over them every few seconds.

In the meantime others on shore were tying tent ropes together and Private Lewis M. Miller, with one end tied to his wrist, was making his way out to his three comrades who were now over a hundred yards from shore. Soon the rope got so heavy that Miller was unable to make further headway, so that others had to swim out and station themselves at intervals along the rope to keep it from dragging Miller under.

Slowly but surely Miller made progress toward the three helpless men, and reached them none too soon, for Dicks and the unknown hero were all but exhausted.

The progress back to shore was even slower than the rope had been in going out, for the slightest pull seemed to submerge those at the outer end of the line. By this time there were a great many on the rope, and men took turns in holding Armstrong and his two exhausted rescuers on the surface. The rescue took a little over twenty-three minutes.

According to Armstrong's statement he tried to ride in on the breakers but the undertow was so strong that he was carried out further than he could swim in. As Armstrong told the Star-Bulletin correspondent while doing guard duty two nights later, "If Dicks and that other fellow hadn't reached me just when they did I wouldn't be a sentinel this evening."
