The two white slavery cases in which Albert Machado is the defendant have been continued in the federal court until next Monday morning at 10 o'clock to be set for trial.

Judge Sanford D. Dole this morning granted to Henry Along one week further in which to file in the federal court in answer to a petition asking that he be adjudged a bankrupt.

The cases against Edward Cluney, charged with having violated the white slave act, have been continued in the federal court until next Monday morning at 10 o'clock to be set for trial.

The members of the federal petty jury have been excused until January 4, 1915. Those members of the jury who are residents of outside islands are requested to obtain their pay from the marshal at their earliest convenience.

By taking the proper oath this morning before Clerk A. Edward Murphy, William Thomas Carden, a graduate of Harvard University, has been admitted to practise law in the local United States court. Mr. Carden, who was recommended to the court by Attorney Frank E. Thompson, is a Honolulu boy and received his early education in this city. He recently was admitted to practise in the circuit court.

A petition asking that George L. William Thomas Carden, a graduate business under the firm name of Honolulu Electric Works, be declared bankrupt has been filed in the federal court by the creditors of the firm. The creditors and the amount of alleged indebtedness are Alexander Koch, \$1,571.50; Carl Koch, \$500; Carlson, Neill & Co., \$155.00, and J. W. Kershner, \$8.25. PARIS, France.—It is recalled that some cities and towns of seven departments of France that were occupied by the Germans in 1870-71 are still under the burden of debt incurred to satisfy the requisitions of the Germans.

The same departments and many of the same towns occupied by Germans during the present war have incurred further burdens. Since the war is waged for the protection of all the territory a project is under consideration to relieve them in part by distributing the charges over the whole territory.

Solomon Kupau received injuries yesterday afternoon through a fall from a bicycle. He alleged that his machine was run down by automobile No. 1591, driven by Kalina. The accident took place on Robello lane, the injured man receiving treatment at the hospital.

Frank Davenport has been held at the central receiving station pending the recovery of Louis Hildebrand, an inmate at the hospital, who declares that Davenport used a knife, inflicting a wound upon his body. The men became involved in a dispute concerning the possession of horses. Hildebrand's injuries are not believed to be serious.

The police toils are gradually tightening about two Filipinos who are alleged by Capt. of Detectives McDuffie to have picked the pocket of a Japanese cane contractor while he was watching the departure of a steamer from pier 7. Today Pedro de la Cruz, a flashily dressed youth, and Antonio Marcella, a companion, were identified by the Japanese as the men who ran into him at the wharf. While the Japanese held a baby and several packages, from his pockets was taken a purse containing \$65. The Filipinos have been booked at the central station with a charge of larceny in the first degree placed opposite their names.

A small amount of money contained in two small savings banks and a purse is the extent of the loss reported by A. R. Gurrey, Jr., whose residence at Manoa valley was entered early yesterday. Capt. of Detectives McDuffie reached the scene within 15 minutes after the burglary and found the empty pocket book and the broken children. Mrs. Gurrey reports the loss of one gold ring. The intruder was discovered by a child who was awakened in an upper room. The police are handicapped in their search by a lack of a description of the robber. For some hours today officers conducted a search for a suspect in the upper portion of the valley.
