HIGH OFFICIALS IN U. S. NAVY IN SILENT DRAMA AT THE POPULAR

"Victory," the spectacular drama of the sea, taken with the permission and aid of the United States navy department, will be the offering at the Popular theater tonight, tomorrow and Friday night. This offering will be shown for three days only, with matinee each day.

Rear-Admiral C. B. T. Moore and his staff have been invited to attend as the guests of the management and witness their fellow naval officers in the role of photo-play actors. The cast of "Victory" includes Josephus Daniels, secretary of the navy; Rear-Admiral Badger, commandant of the North Atlantic fleet, whose prompt action in the Mexican situation last spring was highly commended by the government, and Capt. Benson of the U. S. S. Utah. The manufacturers of this elaborate film are billing it as the "world's greatest spectacular war drama," and it is said to abound with thrilling situations, including naval and land engagements in which fortifications are wrecked and warships sent to Davy Jones' locker.

The use of the hydroaeroplane in modern warfare is demonstrated in several scenes during the action of this film.

As a thriller for those who love the glory of war it would be hard to find a picture that excels "Victory," while for others who are attracted by the gentler pursuit of love, there is a strain of romance—which leads to the wars—running through the entire performance.

An entire change of the Perils of Pauline and a later Pathe Weekly will conclude the performance.

THE CONSPIRACY NEXT OFFERING AT THE BIJOU

"The Conspiracy," the great detective play by Robert Baker and John Emerson, will be presented at the Bijou theater commencing tomorrow night, by the Players All-Star Company. Winthrop Clavering, writer of crime stories and solver of mysteries, is ridiculed by rival literary men and the majority of reporters who claim his successful solutions of baffling crimes have been due to luck rather than skill. A mysterious murder occurs in an apartment house. F. X. BUSHMAN AND COMPANY AT EMPIRE THEATER

Telling a story that will make a strong appeal to those who seek powerful and stirring situations, "The Forlorn Hope," will be found a picture that plainly depicts the trials and difficulties in which an unscrupulous politician brings a corporation.
