**TWO DESTROYERS SUNK**  
**SAYS BERLIN OFFICIALLY.**  
LONDON, England, Dec. 18.—A Reuter's despatch from Berlin says that the official statement of the North Sea raid issued there yesterday claims that in the fight between the British destroyers and the German cruisers off Hartlepool two of the destroyers were sunk, while a third fled badly damaged. The British admiral's official statement does not mention the loss of any warship, but states that five men were killed and fifteen wounded aboard the cruiser *Patrol* and the destroyer *Deon* during the fighting.
