St. Andrew's Cathedral.
At the 7:30 o'clock service in St. Andrew's cathedral on Sunday evening next, there will be given for the first time in Honolulu a sacred cantata entitled "Penitence, Pardon and Peace." This admirable example of a commendable class of church music is from the pen of J. H. Maunier, whose sacred compositions are so well known throughout the English-speaking world. It is of high artistic value, and is a beautiful work, very devotional, exceedingly effective and very tuneful. In addition to the solos and choruses it contains there are three well-known hymns which form the close of each section of the work. In the singing of these the congregation is heartily invited to join.
The choir, consisting of 32 voices, will have for its soloists Miss Mabel Schaefer (soprano) and Reynold McGrew (baritone). Mr. Bode will be at the organ.
