WIDOW TO GET \$500 FOR FATALITY TO HUSBAND

A compromise in the sum of \$500 for the death of Alfonso Marques has been effected between Marques' widow and the United States Fidelity and Guaranty Company, and has been approved by Circuit Judge Whitney.

The accident was due, says the court, apparently to the negligence of a fellow employee. The fidelity company, in which the Lord-Young firm carries employers' liability insurance, compromised with the widow for the sum named.

The court expresses doubt whether, in view of the facts presented to it, Mrs. Marques would have a clear case against the company for greater damages on the ground of greater liability. Mrs. Marques has been appointed guardian of the three small fatherless children, to serve without bond.
