**BODY OF CHINESE SENT  
TO OLD HOME FOR BURIAL**

Just to please his friends they gave  
a swell funeral to Ong-yan-yee, which  
means the goldsmith, but he will be  
temped with his fathers in his native  
village, Kwangtung, continuing his  
journey from Portland when the Mon-  
golia steams out of Pier 7 Friday or  
Saturday.

For many years Ong-yan-yee, the  
only name the ancient Chinese has  
ever done business under, has worked  
Chinese gold into quaint and artistic  
articles at a little shop in Portland's  
Chinatown. A chunk of virgin gold  
and a few tools were all he required  
to convert raw into the beautiful, usu-  
ally the result being a brooch or scarf  
pin that the best goldsmiths of the  
white race have failed to equal in  
workmanship.

Ong-yan-yee died from heart failure  
and his friends decided that he should  
be buried at Kwangtung. So it  
was, but the Portland friends had to  
be satisfied and to this end Ong-yan-  
yee was given an ornate funeral.  
Flowers and Chinese blooms decorat-  
ed his casket when the procession  
started for the cemetery. His remains  
were lowered in the grave, this to sat-  
isfy the Portland Celestials.

But no dirt was shoveled into the  
grave. After all the friends had left,  
those in charge removed the casket  
from the grave and quiet placed it on  
a train, consigned to the Pacific Mail  
wharf in San Francisco. Now the  
great Ong-yan-yee will pass through  
Honolulu.

**EASTER DELICATESSEN SALE.**


The usual Easter delicatessen sale
