IDZUMO GIVES \$100 FOR F-4 RELIEF FUNDS

The Idzumo was alleged by report from Japan and China to have had a spirited engagement with the German cruiser Leipzig off the coast of Lower California during the early part of December. The Idzumo is said to have remained near Turtle Bay for some weeks until a California salvage company began its work in attempting to raise the sunken vessel.

CHIYO MARU WENT INTO DRYDOCK AT NAGASAKI

A broken propeller caused a slight delay to the big Toyo Kisen Kaisha liner Chiyo Maru at Nagasaki, Japan. With 128 Asiatic steamer passengers and 989 tons of Oriental cargo, the steamer came to an anchorage at quarantine shortly after noon today.

Redwood and other products have left the California coast for Honolulu in the schooner Oceania Vance. The vessel is due from Eureka about April 20.

Captain William Patterson, Columbia river pilot for the Associated Oil Company, has been named commissioner of the port of Portland to succeed Fred N. Pendleton.

The Matson Navigation steamer Hyades will visit at least four island ports before completing its return cargo of 6000 tons of sugar for delivery at California refineries.

Taking 3300 tons of sugar, the Matson chartered steamer Francis Hanly left Hilo for San Francisco late Saturday. The vessel left some of its outward cargo at Honolulu.

Part of the fuel oil supplied the Union Oil Company's steamer Santa Maria at Port San Luis may be discharged at an island port other than Honolulu. The tanker is due at Honolulu.

The Pacific Mail liner Persia with a few layover passengers and a later mail steamed from San Francisco to Honolulu on Saturday. The vessel is due here Friday morning. It will take 400 tons of coal before continuing the voyage to Japan, China and the Philippines.

With general cargo from San Francisco, the schooner Defender is expected to arrive at Hana, Maui, the latter part of the month. The Defender will be given a return cargo of sugar, according to present expectations of its agents.

THE TIPPERARY AUTHORS. The authors of "Tipperary" will soon have to hold a convention to determine precedence. Harry Williams, lately of the Gaiety company at the Morisco, coyly privately admitted that he wrote the war ballad. Another Harry Williams over in London sent communications to the effect that he dashed it off one day.

But now comes Mrs. Alice Smythe Jay of Honolulu and produces facsimiles of the scores showing that she wrote the melody and had it produced on February 26, 1909, under the name of "Yakima," by the Women's Club of Yakima. The Honolulu Star-Bulletin of March 20 publishes the scores of "Yakima" and of "Tipperary." They are identical, the differences being negligible, consisting of one or two notes. She describes that one morning in the last Christmas holidays she was awakened by a motor party passing her house singing "Tipperary" and she recognized it at once as her own music; she bought a copy the next day and verified her claim. Either of the Authors Harry Williams now can have the floor.—Los Angeles Examiner.
