## DISTINGUISHED CHINESE WELCOMED TO AMERICA BY MEN OF HONOLULU

Leaving behind many expressions of good will for the territory, and expressing the hope that the present friendly relations between America and China in Hawaii may exist forever, the distinguished Chinese merchants and businessmen who are on their way to the mainland to return a call made five years ago by representatives of the chambers of commerce of the Pacific coast, departed from Honolulu in the Manchuria today.

The party arrived last night, accompanied by Capt. Robert Dollar, owner of the Dollar Line of steamships, and B. Atwood Robinson of Shanghai, honorary adviser to the Chinese ministry of agriculture and commerce. The members of the party received their first welcome into the United States by a delegation from the Chamber of Commerce of Honolulu, which met the Chinese as the steamer docked. The committee consisted of President Fred L. Waldron, Secretary Raymond C. Brown, Wallace R. Farrington, John Waterhouse, James L. McLean, S. S. Paxson, C. K. Al, R. O. Matheson, Chinese Consul Tsz-ang Wooluan and Dr. F. K. Li.

Following the docking of the ship the members of the party were taken to the Country Club where greetings were exchanged and a dinner served. Several brief addresses were made by both the members of the Chinese party and the chamber delegation, President Waldron recalling the hospitality and entertainment tendered the representatives of the American chambers when they visited China.

The Chinese party is headed by S. Chong-Hsun, a prominent merchant of Peking and a member of the national council. The department of labor of the United States has delegated Commissioner General of Immigration Caminetti to meet the party at San Francisco and accompany it on its American trip.

Other members of the party are Lam-Pak Chang, Canton, Sheng Chen, Peking, Yen-Pei Huang, Kiangsu province; Sing-Ming Kung, Shanghai; Huan-Yi Liang, Chansha, Chi-Chi Nieh, Shantung; Chao-Hsin Pan, Tientsin; Chong-Hsun Chang, Chefoo; S. Thomas Sze, Tientsin; Chia Yu, Soochow; Hsieh Yu, Huichow; David Z. T. Yui, Peking; Chai-Chang Woo, Peking; Z. T. K. Woo, Hanyang; Kuan-Lan Sun, Peking; Kwong Wong, Hankow; James H. Lee, Shanghai, and Li-Chi Chu, Shanghai. They represent many industries, businesses and organizations.





## When the Chick is about two months old—

This mash mixture is the result of great care and is perfectly balanced to feed in conjunction with our grain foods. Feed it dry to growing and breeding stock producing eggs for hatching. Feed it wet, moistened with milk or water to hens producing market eggs. It contains no drugs or condiments. Green feed should be continued. There should, however, be in some easily accessible location hoppers containing grit, crushed oyster shell and ground dried bone.

If there is not an abundance of free range which will keep the young birds busy hunting for green food and insects it is well to teach them to scratch by using **Progressive Scratch Food** in deep litter once a day. Exercise is just as important to growing pullets as it is to the laying hen.

The birds can be introduced to hoppers of beef scrap, grit, oyster shells and charcoal such as are used in the laying house. The ration for a flock of pullets becomes very nearly the same as that for a flock of laying hens.

## BEAUTIFUL SERVICE HERE FOR YOUNG WOMAN WHOSE DEATH OCCURRED AT SEA

Among the passengers on the Manchuria were Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Clarke, who have lived 15 years in Manila. Their daughter, Mrs. Gertrude Clarke Holland, died at sea on April 24 at 5:30 a. m. The parents and their daughter were on the Minnesota when it was wrecked and the excitement seriously affected Mrs. Holland, who had a weak heart, the result of an attack of inflammatory rheumatism years ago.

Mr. and Mrs. Clarke are friends of Gen. Edward Davis and of his son, Maj. Alexander Davis. Gen. Davis being absent from Honolulu, his daughter, Mrs. H. McK. Harrison, and Mr. Harrison received a wireless from the steamer and made arrangements to meet them. Bishop Restarick lived in San Diego, Cal., when Mrs. Holland was born, and baptized her when an infant. When the Manchuria docked at 7 p. m. he was informed of the desire of the parents to have the burial service of the church, and he at once got a choir of girls from St. Andrew's priory so that when the body was brought to the cathedral by H. H. Williams, the undertaker, all was ready. The mother was deeply touched and much pleased that it was possible to have music and, curiously, the hymns she wanted were those already selected. The bishop read the entire service, and with Mrs. Folsom at the organ, the 20 girls sang the burial chant and the hymns, "A Guide With Me" and "Peace, Perfect Peace." There were present Bishop and Mrs. Restarick, Mr. and Mrs. H. McK. Harrison and Miss E. McLeod and Mrs. Folsom, formerly of San Diego.

The Clarks lived five years in San Diego, leaving in 1891, and they had never met Bishop Restarick and his family since that time. Mr. Clarke had passed through Honolulu but the bishop had been absent at the time. The parents expressed themselves as deeply grateful for the beautiful and comforting service at the cathedral, which they said was exactly as they would have arranged it themselves.

The body was cremated and the ashes were taken by the parents and later they will be deposited in the burial ground of the family in Omaha, where Mr. Clarke has a brother, a prominent business man there.
