SHIPPING & WATERFRONT NEWS

JAPANESE SEEK A GIVES UP QUEST OF CONGESTION NOT

TRADE OUTLET IN SOUTH SEAS AMBERGRIS IN PACIFIC RELIEVED BY SHERIDAN

Japanese businessmen seek a new market in the South Pacific, with the practical elimination of German interests from groups of islands, say officers in the freighter Amagisan Maru, now at Honolulu from Japan with a full cargo including coal and general merchandise and provisions, a portion of which will be landed at Ocean and other neighboring islands.

The Japanese steamer completed passage from Mororan, Japan, in 18 days. It was given a berth at the Inter-Island Steam Navigation wharf, where about 4000 tons of coal will be discharged. Captain Umeda expected to load a full shipment of phosphate rock at Ocean island for Japan.

The Amagisan Maru is one of the first vessels flying the Japanese colors to take up the new trade in the South Pacific. Other freight carriers have called here and departed for the South Seas, but in the early stages of the war they were expected to carry supplies to a Japanese fleet.


