PANORAMA OF EXPOSITION IS SHOWN IN FILMS AT POPULAR

There was a large crowd at the matinee at the Popular theater this afternoon to greet the first pictures of the Panama-Pacific exposition. The audience was thoroughly pleased with the performance because it is something entirely different, and because the pictures so vividly present the exposition as it is.

Aside from being a wonderful panorama of the world's exhibits at the San Francisco fair, the pictures, as an educational feature, can not be overlooked. The architecture of the old world buildings is reproduced in the manner in which they are built in the countries they represent. The Italian building is of the old Gothic type; the Swiss building is surrounded by an immense forest backed with snow-capped mountains, showing the

rugged character of that country. There are some of the things that educate the children in a manner that no amount of book study can produce.

And, in the event they should grow tired of the educational features, as a diversion the "Big Zoo" is cast upon the screen. This is the animal side of the pictures, for many things the children read of in their nursery books are produced at the fair. The Bay Blue, the dog house, Mother Goose, all the famous so-called children's games, are brought before them in life-like scenes. These things, combined with the grandeur of the exposition, make the pictures well worth seeing.

The pictures will be shown tonight and tomorrow night, with a matinee tomorrow afternoon.

CASPER RECITAL PROMISES MUCH MUSICAL MERIT

There are several reasons why the Casper recital should meet with pronounced success. First, because of Mr. Casper's mastery of the violin, then because of the object of the recital, and because of the generosity of Casper in being ever-willing to assist in any undertaking where his services would be considered helpful. On this occasion he has surrounded himself with assistants of well-known ability, some of whom have more than local reputations, and the program will be one that will please musicians as well as those who enjoy melodious strains regardless of their origin.

The demand for tickets is large and indications point to a well-filled house but this fact should not deter those who love good music from securing their seats early, for Bishop Hall, at Punahou, where the concert will be given, is not over large, and good seats may be at a premium. WAR PICTURES PACK YE LIBERTY

The added feature at Ye Liberty theater for the present week, "History of the World's Greatest War," is proving one of the best attractions that has been shown in Honolulu in many months. JUNGLE BEASTS ARE FEATURED AT THE EMPIRE

Wild animals in captivity, said to be the finest collection brought to the United States, now at the New York zoological garden, are a never-ending source of entertainment and instruction. By the assistance of the camera, the beasts from the jungles of Africa and India are featured in an educational production to be shown at the Empire theater today. The photography is excellent. Months were spent by a corps of experts in securing the pictures.

"The Diamond in the Rough" presents a remarkable blending of romance and comedy set in picturesque scenes. Guy Coombs and Anita Nilsson have important parts in a production staged in California. It combines excellent acting with a genuinely dramatic plot. Miss Cora Millanta has taken the role of Valeira, who is married to Mortensen, a so-called self-made man. She takes a decided dislike to him and it is only through the sorrow after a great sacrifice that all ends well. Adapted from a story that has just completed a successful run in a leading monthly magazine, a film of unusual interest, "Her Trip to New York" eliminates much of the tragic for the humorous. The Dughable farce, "The Stuff that Dreams are Made of," in two parts, will close a well-balanced bill.


