ONLY COURSE TO TRANSFER SHIPS TO FOREIGN FLAG

That Is the Attitude of Pacific Mail Directors, Says General Manager Schwerin

The directors of the Pacific Mail Steamship Company probably decided on Wednesday of this week whether or not to transfer steamers to a foreign flag—a course of action which if adopted will practically eliminate Honolulu so far as passenger traffic from here to the mainland is concerned.

This information is contained in a letter received by Albert P. Taylor, assistant secretary of the Promotion Committee, from H. P. Wood, secretary, who last week consulted at San Francisco with R. P. Schwerin, vice-president and general manager of the Pacific Mail, concerning the company's probable course when the new shipping law comes into effect. The new law, by its regulations, will make the operation of Pacific Mail steamers so costly that they will have to be transferred to another flag, or else tie up indefinitely at San Francisco.

"As you know," writes Mr. Wood, "the Matson Navigation Company quite recently made plans for a new freight steamer somewhat smaller than the 'Manoa.' They were later changed by adding passenger accommodations, but they have withdrawn all plans now, and everything is up in the air with them, though I feel that if the Pacific Mail Company should go under a foreign flag that the Matson Navigation Company might feel justified in building a new steamer even larger and faster than the Matsonia, but of course this is all in the future."

"Just now the only outlook the Pacific Mail directors can see is to place their steamers under a foreign flag."

23 DEFENDANTS AIR THEIR TROUBLES IN U. S. COURT TODAY

Twenty-three defendants, their alleged offenses ranging from destroying mail and smuggling opium to selling obscene literature, and statutory misdemeanors, were arraigned before Judge Charles F. Clemons in federal court this morning, making one of the heaviest Saturday morning sessions the court has experienced in many months.

Aki, a Chinese, who went down to one of the steamers and purchased two dollars' worth of opium, was sent to Oahu prison for 15 days. An eloquent plea for a light sentence was made by Attorney Carden, who said that the defendant had been a habitual user of the poppy drug for the past 20 years. He also said that Aki was a poor man and that he recently lost his wife and family through death.

Ku, who pleaded guilty to a statutory offense, was given one month in Oahu prison and one-half the costs of the case. A plea at bar was filed in the case of John P. Mendiola, charged with having destroyed certain mail matter. The case has been continued a week. In the majority of the other cases continuances were in order for plea or further hearing.

The twenty-fourth defendant was not in court. He is John J. McGrath and he is wanted on an opium charge. He failed to answer when his name was called and the case was continued. McGrath recently escaped from the city and county jail and has not yet been apprehended.

INVESTIGATION OF 'BOOZE PARTY' TO BE MADE SHORTLY

School Inspector Will Confer With Superintendent Kinney and Police May Be Called

Within a few days George S. Raymond, inspector of public schools, will take up with Superintendent Henry W. Kinney the advisability of an investigation of the alleged "booze party" held in the Pohukaina school, Kakaako, the night of April 27, the details of which were published in the Star-Bulletin yesterday.

Mr. Raymond said today that he believes it will be an easy matter to locate the persons who participated in the party which, according to the testimony of two Hawaiian pupils, was attended by "sailors and marines, plenty."

"I think it will be quite an easy matter," he said, "as several of the persons attending the party wrote their names on the blackboards. The thing I regret is the obscene matter which was written on the boards and which was left for teachers and pupils to erase. I believe that there was sufficient evidence when the police arrived the next day to enable the police to locate the persons. The Japanese whom the Hawaiian boys say was beaten by those who attended the party might be able to tell something."

Following Mr. Raymond's conference with Superintendent Kinney, the matter probably will be placed in the hands of the police.
