BAN ON POOR LIQUOR. (By Associated Press.) CAIRO, Egypt.—Martial law has made it a dangerous matter for the peddlers of adulterated liquor to attempt business near the British encampments in Egypt. By proclamation, Lieut.-gen. Sir J. Maxwell has empowered special officers to enter and inspect bars' establishments suspected of selling bad liquor within a radius of five miles of any place where British troops are stationed.

Fort Shafter Notes

(Special Star-Bulletin Correspondence) FORT SHAFTER, May 14.—One hundred recruits for the 2nd infantry arrived on the transport yesterday and were assigned to companies as follows: Co. A, 11; Co. B, 7; Co. C, 10; Co. D, 7; Co. E, 7; Co. F, 6; Co. G, 6; Co. H, 9; Co. I, 8; Co. K, 10; Co. L, 8; Co. M, 11. This is the first draft of recruits received for many months in which there was no sickness. As a rule measles and mumps develop among new men on their way to their station, resulting in quarantine.

The amateur night at the 2nd Infantry aerodome will be the largest performance ever attempted by a military organization in the way of theatricals. The night has been definitely decided upon as Friday, May 14, and from the enthusiasm already evident the large aerodome will hardly be large enough to accommodate the crowd. No profit is derived from the shows at the playhouse but a nominal charge is made for seats to enable the management to supply good picture films and other amusements for the men of the garrison. Lieut. Cook has taken personal charge of the erection of a stage and the many vaudeville acts scheduled for the evening have been rehearsed in the presence of critics and none but the best chosen. While the show is intended as an opportunity for budding footlight stars to get a start in the theatrical world, two of the men are in the professional class, having appeared in the best vaudeville circuits on the mainland, and are top notchers in their line. The stars are Privates Marshall of Co. F and Dan Casey of the Hospital Corps. The performance will start promptly at 7:30.

The new recruits arriving on the transport have been grouped into one company, designated Recruit Co. No. 1. Lieut. Campanole has been detailed as instructor with Lieuts. Reed and Foster as assistants. One non-commissioned officer from each company has been detailed to assist in the training. The recruits will be rationed with their companies.

Lieuts. Silvester and McAndrew have been attached to Co. E for target practise.

KINNEY WANTS LOCAL SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS

The board of supervisors shortly will be asked by Henry W. Kinney, superintendent of public instruction, to authorize the following school improvements from funds appropriated by the last legislature:

- Molokai—Two bungalows and toilet. Waikiki—Three-room building, one bungalow, toilet, fence. Royal—Three-room building. Kaula—Two bungalows, kitchen, general changes. Kaahumanu—One bungalow. Moanalua—Two bungalows. Waiialua—Two bungalows, kitchen and toilet. Kailua—One-room building of Kaneohe type. Kaneohe—Two-room building of Kaneohe type. Waipahu—One bungalow. Kaaawa—One-room building of Kaneohe type. Kaneohe—Three-room building of Kaneohe type. Panoa—One bungalow. Kaulawela—Six or seven bungalows. Waianae—One bungalow. Kalahele—One bungalow. Watertown—One bungalow and toilet; present building should be moved to the school lot which the territory is in the process of acquiring. Waihiwa—One bungalow and teachers' cottage needed. Pearl City—One bungalow needed. Hanalei—Two-room building of Kaneohe type needed.
