NILE CARRYING CAROLINE BEATS ALLIES TO SCHOONER SLADE

The Pacific Mail steamer Nile, chartered to the British admiralty at the beginning of the European war, is taking a prominent part in the transportation of troops now participating in the Dardanelles campaign.

That the Nile would not be returned to the transpacific trade until after the close of the conflict was the prediction made today. The vessel is said to have been equipped to carry passengers rather than freight.

When the Persia called at Nagasaki, Japan, repairs to the Great Northern steamer Minnesota were nearing completion. The Leviathan was expected to go into commission the middle of June on its regular run between Puget Sound and Japan, China and Manila.

The Persia landed two cabin passengers and 450 tons of Oriental freight. It is expected to steam to San Francisco at 4 o'clock this afternoon.

Among the Asiatic steamer passengers for Honolulu were 68 Filipinos, three Chinese and 30 Japanese. The through list of travelers include 59 cabin, 22 second-class and 101 Asiatic steerage.
