

How Could These Ball Players Ever Make Good Slide For Third Base ?

Baseball in the Philippines has done what legislation and the Moral Progress League have failed to do in the way of checking pernicious gambling habits. The picture shows the baseball uniforms of the Igorotes which though not so "pretty" as the ordinary diamond suit, are arresting in the extreme.

"We found baseball to be the keynote to Filipino morality," says Dean C. Worcester. "The cockfighting and

gambling formed the wall to advance in moral uplift and it was only by creating another sport that we were able to draw the crowds away from the cock pits. The cock pit managers protested and asked that legislation be enacted restricting baseball to once a week, which shows how baseball affected the former sport."

"Even the old men have gone wild over the game," says the former secretary of the interior. "It seems strange indeed to see the old Igorote,

more stolid than the American Indian, toss his hat in the air in the wild exuberance of a fanatical baseball fan. Legislation failed to regulate cockfighting, moral progress societies accomplished nothing, but since we instituted the American baseball game the cockpit has been deserted."

Mr. Worcester lectures on the Philippines this evening at the University Club. The proceeds will be given to the Leahy home.


