HARBOR NOTES

The Standard Oil tanker Atlas is due from San Francisco late this afternoon with oil for Honolulu.
Advice has been received to the effect that the T. K. K. steamer Tenyo Maru will arrive in Honolulu from Yokohama at 9 o'clock Monday morning.
The Marion Chilcott, Associated Oil tanker, arrived today from Gaviots, Cal., with 17,000 barrels of oil for the Associated Oil Company's local agency.
Announcement was made today that the inter-island had purchased the lumber schooner Omega and will soon tow it to Hilo with a cargo of sand.
William Cummings and Joseph Santos, the two new harbor policemen appointed by the harbor commission on Harbormaster Foster's recommendation, took office yesterday.

The new harbor works in Viaduct-Stock have been completed, and were opened to public use on May 1. It is said that the new harbor is large enough to hold 10 steamers.

No word has been received by T. H. Davies & Co. as to the expected arrival of the cable ship Strathcona, which was due here last Wednesday. The Strathcona will take supplies from the Niagara July 23 and transfer them to Fanning Island.

Several Honoluluans who had planned to take the Sierra to the mainland on the next trip, which was cancelled yesterday, will board the Matsuo steamer Hilonian, which will make a special trip to San Francisco July 23 with 35 passengers in the cabin.

The American-Hawaiian steamer Dakotan sailed from Hilo for the Delaware breakwater last night with 9000 tons of sugar. The Arizonian is due Sunday with 2500 tons of cargo from the east coast and 2500 tons from the west coast for Honolulu. Among her cargo are 678 hogs and 28 cattle and horses for this port.

Fred Ehrman, first officer of the steamer Mackinaw and formerly second officer of the Korea, has been named captain of the Mackinaw to succeed E. G. Krebs, who resigned and left on the Wilhelmina Wednesday for New York from where he will take a dollar steamer to the west coast. The Mackinaw is due to sail for Sydney tomorrow.

The American steamer Colon, owned by the American-Mexican steamship company, is docked at the quarantine wharf from Portland with a cargo of oats for Australia. Owing to lack of fumigation, the vessel was taken to the quarantine wharf on arrival late yesterday. She has taken on 300 tons of bunker coal, and was fumigated outside of the harbor today prior to her departure. The oats cargo numbers 25,323 bags.


