**THEATRICAL OFFERINGS**

**Shows Hypocrisy In Home**

With the indorsement of leaders in almost every walk of life, "Hypocrites" continues to draw packed houses to the Liberty theater, many having been turned away again last night owing to lack of accommodations. There is no doubt but that "Hypocrites" has a punch that reaches everyone—a punch that hurts. In the "Mirror of Truth" is reflected the hypocrisies of the world of society, of fashion, of politics, of the church and of the home. In "society" the "Naked Truth" is not allowed to enter unless she wears a veil—no matter how flimsy she must simulate some covering in conformity with the rules laid down by the smart set—as little as they themselves wear will suffice. "The Naked Truth" appears frequently in the picture, but proves a great disappointment to those who visit the Liberty theater for the purpose of merely seeing a nude woman on the screen.

**MILL HAND BECOMES GOVERNOR**

In "The High Hand," a five-part photo-play from the novel by Jacques Futelle, which will open this evening at the Popular Theater for a week's run, Carlyle Blackwell enacts the leading part of Jim Warren of Warberton, a mill hand, who successfully works his way up to the governorship of a state. This film is one of the latest releases on the famous Alliance program, and comes to Honolulu with high indorsement as a photo-drama. Edna Tillinghast, the heroine of the story, furnishes the heart interest, and is enacted by Neva Gerber. William Brunton, as Big Tom Simmonds, a saloon keeper, and Douglas Gerrard, as Francis Everard Lewis, the political state boss, fight Jim Warren tooth and nail for the possession of the political machine of the state. John Sheehan, as Franques, secretary to Lewis, enacts the part of the go-between who double-crosses Lewis and unsuccessfully tries to do the same thing to Jim Warren. The story abounds in excellent action, and the machinations of the political intriguers form an excellent background for the clear-cut delineation of sterling manhood portrayed by Carlyle Blackwell, as Jim Warren.

**LEW FIELDS TO FOLLOW 'MONEY'**

"Money," the great sociological melodrama, prophesying a rupture in the strained relations of capital and labor in the year 1921, continues to prove a popular offering at the Bijou theater, where good-sized audiences are nightly experiencing thrill upon thrill and, incidentally, assimilating considerable knowledge of modern-day methods of finance. This film will continue tonight, and will be shown tomorrow night for the last time. It is an offering by a new author who is his own producer.
