HONGKONG BANKS MORTON THINKS GET \$500,000 IN SILVER PACIFIC MAIL WILL QUIT

Bringing eight passengers for a stopover in Honolulu, \$500,000 in silver for Hongkong banks, 377 sacks of mail for this city, and carrying about 5500 tons of cargo, mainly ship-building steel for Kobe, Japan, the Toyo Kisen Kaisha liner Tenyo Maru docked at the Alakea street wharf shortly after 8 o'clock this morning. She is to sail again for the Orient at 4 o'clock this afternoon.

Purser T. C. McCombe and Commander S. Togo reported a pleasant voyage. The boat has on board a total of 515 passengers, of whom 119 are traveling second-class. There are 216 Asiatics in the steerage.

Among the many notables on the Tenyo Maru this morning were Dr. Simon Flexner, Dr. Wallace Butterick, President Justice Frederick Henshaw of the California supreme court, former Captain H. E. Morton of the Pacific Mail liner Mongolia, C. H. Magee, commissioner for the Philippines of the U. S. Department of Education; Napoleone Reya, minister from Brazil to Japan, and numerous others.

J. K. Pickering, assistant auditor for the government in the Philippines, is on the liner, returning to Manila. Mr. and Mrs. J. H. Rainey and daughter are on board. They are Los Angeles residents. Mr. Rainey is a big lumber man of the Southern California metropolis.

HARBOR NOTES

The Hyades is at Maui loading sugar for San Francisco. The boat left here last night.

Due here from Puget Sound, the steamer Minnesota should arrive Sunday night or Monday morning.

The four-masted schooner Sadie entered port this morning, bringing lumber.

Sailing of the U. S. Transport Sherman is not expected to take place before tomorrow night at 6 o'clock, and perhaps Sunday, owing to repairs to the boat's propeller, and freight and coal which have to be loaded.

Nearly 50,000 barrels of fuel oil were unloaded here today from the tanker Santa Maria, which came in yesterday from Port San Luis, California, with 44,000 barrels of oil and 450 drums of gasoline and distillate for the Union Oil Company.

When the Oceanic liner Ventura left here late yesterday, Englishmen and Irishmen on board were much delighted with selections played by the Royal Hawaiian band. The band played Irish and English songs, and ended with "It's a Long, Long Way to Tipperary."

"I am quite in the dark as to what the Pacific Mail is going to do, except that I was told by high officials of the company that the line is absolutely going out of business November 2," said H. E. Morton, former captain of the Pacific Mail liner Mongolia, this morning, just before he walked down the gangplank of the Tenyo Maru.

Mr. Morton denied that he is en route to China on any mysterious mission relative to selling the Pacific Mail's largest boats to Chinese lines, or the proposed Chinese-American line.

"Steamer lines do not concern me any more," he remarked jovially as he lighted a cigarette. "I'm simply going over to Shanghai to go into business with Barclay & Company, a New York firm having an office there and doing a general importing and exporting business. There's nothing to that 'mysterious mission' rumor. The Pacific Mail people told me, however, that they mean business and are going to clear out absolutely in November. I can tell you that for a certainty."

THOMAS TO HAVE NEW SET OF BLADES

Because the new propeller blades for the United States transport Thomas weighs 4300 pounds, and the two other old blades only tip the scales at 3100, the latter have to come off and be replaced by the heavier blades, because the heavier blade would overbalance the other two and make the propeller action uneven, much the same as a locomotive driving wheel with too heavy a counter-balance.

The transport is a twin-screw vessel. The starboard propeller's three blades, of bronze, are 21 years old, and apparently in as good condition today as ever. Why one of the port propeller blades should have snapped off at its base remains a mystery.

Work of installing the three new propeller blades will probably be finished tomorrow morning. Each blade weighs over two tons and stands as high as a tall man. The old blades will probably be kept in reserve to replace any which may break on the other propeller. The Thomas is in drydock and will take coal and freight while her propeller is receiving attention. The Thomas may start for the Orient tomorrow evening or Sunday.


