TRY THESE HINTS. When your house plants look a trifle dejected, and water does not revive them, try putting coffee grounds on the roots three times a week; then once a week give them a tablespoonful of olive oil; do not allow the earth to become hard and dry.

If white of egg is applied with a small camel's hair paintbrush to fly specks on gilt frames, then rubbed gently with a soft cloth, the specks will disappear.

Wash linoleum and oilcloth with luke warm water, then polish it with a soft woolen cloth which has been dipped in milk.

Use no soap on window glass. Use old muslin and clean soft water. A cotton cloth dipped in a little alcohol will add brilliancy to the final rub.

Never use linen to clean mirrors or windows, as it sheds lint and often causes streaks.

AIR CRAFT FOUND IN DARK BY NEW DEVICE OF AMERICAN

NEW YORK, N. Y.—Edward F. Chandler, inventor of a system of harbor defense now being tested by the United States navy for the detection of the approach of submarines and battleships with the aid of water microphones, announced that he has perfected a method of detecting and locating dirigibles by the microphone. Chandler said that one of the greatest applications of the airship finder would be as a defense against night raids such as the Germans have made upon London. He declared he could easily discover the range, height, speed and direction of a dirigible or other aircraft in the darkest night. Then, he said, anti-aircraft guns could be used against the invaders.

NEW 'FEWEL' IS OFFERED NAVY BY BUDDING GENIUS

Had the "fewel" offered to the navy department recently by an eastern inventor, also its method of delivery on board ship, been adopted Honoluluans might some day have enjoyed the sight of the armored cruiser Maryland being coaled by firing the sacks of combustible on board from guns on a collier. Here is the story as told by the Army and Navy Register: "The inventor informed the naval authorities that it could be put up in any conceivable shape and could be made water-tight and non-sinkable. He proposed to send to the department a shipment of 100 pounds with the privilege of the purchase for a reasonable sum of the formality of this new 'fewel'.

"The writer of the letter stated that his composition could be packed in canvas sacks, each attached to a line and fired from a gun on board the collier. By this means coal could be delivered on a warship with celerity, if not certainty. It would be possible to attach bags to an endless rope and haul them on board ship in rapid succession.

"The departmental officials were duly impressed with the originality of the proposal, which was filed with the courteous acknowledgment of the communication."

ROMANCE OF PRINCE BORIS MAY BE ENDED BY BULGARIA'S MOVE

(By Associated Press) SOFIA.—The announcement that Prince Boris, the crown prince of Bulgaria, will be commander-in-chief of the Bulgarian army, recalls the love affair between him and the Russian emperor's eldest daughter, the Princess Olga. The engagement has been announced by the papers on two occasions, and, while not officially confirmed, his visits to the Czar have given color to the romance. He knows Petrograd better than any city outside his own country, and prefers it to any other foreign city. Prince Boris is only 21 years old and is the eldest of four children by King Ferdinand's first wife, the Princess Marie Louise of Parma. While King Ferdinand remains a Roman Catholic, Prince Boris is a Greek Catholic. The prince's conversion, which took place at the early age of
