### MANY KINDS OF SONGS INCLUDED BY OPERA STAR

Miss Inga Orner, Norwegian Soprano, to Give Unusual Concert at Opera House

Manager W. D. Adams of the Hawaiian Opera House has announced that Miss Inga Orner, the great Norwegian soprano will give her first and probably her only recital in Honolulu the evening of Saturday, November 27. The Norwegian songbird comes directly from a successful concert tour of the mainland, visiting the islands to recuperate from a season of hard work and travel. For several seasons she was with the Metropolitan Opera Company of New York, and prior to her American debut had scored a triumph at Covent Garden, London. She has sung in grand opera in many European capitals. Her voice is said to be a lyric, coloratura soprano of unusual range; fresh, clear and of marvelous sweetness.

One feature of her recital here is the rich variety promised by her carefully selected program. There will be something that each may understand and enjoy. She speaks five languages, and this linguistic versatility has enabled her to prepare a collection of musical numbers rare and cosmopolitan to a marked degree.

One need not be a student of classical music to enjoy Miss Orner's recital, judging from the program. There will be classical songs, of course, including some grand opera selections, but in addition she promises to give some of the simple, beautiful refrains wherein the masses may judge whether she has true ability and depth of understanding.


