

MUST GIVE GOOD REASONS TO GET PASSPORTS NOW

Regulations Made More Stringent; Objects of Visits to Foreign Parts Demanded

Unless they can satisfy the department of state that they have very good reasons for so doing, tourists who contemplate taking trips to the Orient or other foreign countries will experience considerable difficulty in obtaining passports, for the time being, at least.

Notices of several important changes in the passport regulations have been received by Foster L. Davis, clerk of the local United States court and, as the demand for passports has been unusually heavy during the last few months, prospective tourists are warned to carefully read over the new rules. No passport shall be granted or issue to, or verified for, any other persons than those owing allegiance to the United States.

The former custom of issuing passports called for only one copy. Under the new regulations, applications must be in duplicate.

That part of the new regulations regarding the purpose of visits to foreign countries reads, in part, as follows:

"He is also required to state the names of the foreign countries which he expects to visit, and the objects of his visits thereto. The latter statement should be brief and general in form, thus: 'Commercial business.' An applicant who states that he is going abroad on commercial business must support his application with a letter from the head of the firm or firms which he represents, stating the names of the countries it is necessary to visit and the objects of his visits thereto.

"An applicant who is going abroad for any other purpose must satisfy the department of state that it is imperative that he go, and submit satisfactory documentary evidence substantiating his statement concerning the imperative nature of his proposed trip.

Under the former regulations, a man might secure a passport for himself, his wife and minor children. The new regulations say:

"In view of the regulations now in force in European countries, it is advisable that wives, children over nine years of age and servants would have separate passports, applied for in the same way as a passport for the head of the family."

BIG PENALTY IMPOSED ON DE LIMA REMITTED

The \$500 penalty imposed by the federal court on Frank de Lima of Hilo, who pleaded guilty to a charge of conducting a still for the illicit manufacture of liquor and who was also fined and given a prison sentence, has been remitted by President Wilson, according to information which has been received by District Attorney Horace W. Vaughan. De Lima served his sentence and paid the fine, but, because he owned land in Hilo, was unable to take the poor convict's oath. The federal authorities could have brought a civil suit against de Lima for the recovery of the penalty, had it not been remitted, and in this event his homestead would have been attached.
