Street within Frontage Improve-
ment Number One, to the Terri-
tory of Hawaii and to all persons in-
terested generally:
Notice is hereby given that in ac-
cordance with Resolution No. 471 and
with the Report of the City and
County Engineer, dated March 15,
1916, including the Corrected Map and
Preliminary Assessment Roll for
Frontage Improvement Number One—
Lusitana Street, the Board of Super-
visors propose to assess the property
abutting on said portion of Lusitana
Street, as provided by Sections 1793-
1813, R. L. of Hawaii, 1915, as amend-
ed by Act 164, Session Laws of Ha-
waii, 1915, as follows:

1. The boundaries of said Frontage
Improvement and the abutting land
subject to assessment are the same as
heretofore established by Resolution
No. 395 of said Board, and as set forth
in detail in said Corrected Map and
Preliminary Assessment Roll, herein
specifically referred to and incor-
porated;

2. The total cost of the improve-
ments upon said Lusitana Street,
based upon the bid of Lord-Young En-
gineering Company, Limited, hereto-
fore conditionally accepted, will be
\$39,916.60;

3. The rate for general improve-
ments, including grading, paving, mov-
ing and resetting of curbs, drainage,
engineering and incidentals, to be
assessed against all property abutting
upon said portion of Lusitana Street
will be \$3.185043;

4. In addition to the above rate,
wherever new curbing is necessary
and provided by said improvements,
the property in front of which the
same shall be required will be as-
sessed \$0.85 per front foot; the exact
and detailed amounts of new curbing
required for each individual frontage
and the assessments therefor are
shown on said Corrected Map and Pre-
liminary Assessment Roll, herein in-
corporated;

5. Assessments shall be due and
payable within thirty days after the
date of the last publication of the
Assessment Ordinance relating thereto,
to be hereafter enacted; provided
that assessments may be paid at the
election of the owner of the land
assessed in ten equal annual instal-
ments of principal, together with in-
terest on unpaid principal at 6% per
annum, the first of said instalments to
be due and payable within thirty days
after the last publication of the Ordi-
nance aforesaid; failure to pay the
whole of any assessment within said
period of thirty days will be conclusively
held an election on the part of the
persons interested in such assess-
ments, whether under a disability or
otherwise, to pay in instalments; fail-
ure to pay the whole or any instalment
will be enforced as provided in Sec-
tions 1793-1813, Revised Laws, 1915,
as amended by Act 164, Session Laws,
1915;

6. An issue of District Improvement
Bonds will be authorized for the
amount of, and for the period of, de-
ferred instalments of assessments;

7. The proportion of cost to be
borne by the City and County of Hono-
lulu and the proportion of cost
assumed on behalf of the Territory of
Hawaii by that certain Supplementary
Agreement between the Territory of
Hawaii and the City and County of
Honolulu, dated December 14, 1915,
all set forth in detail in said Cor-
rected Map and Preliminary Assess-
ment Roll, shall be payable in a com-
mon fund, to be known as Frontage
Improvement Number One—Lusitana
Street, forthwith upon the final award
and due execution of the contract for
said improvements on said Lusitana
Street.

8. And notice is further given that
a Public Hearing will be held be-
fore the Board of Supervisors at their
Assembly Hall respecting the proposed
assessments on March 28th, 1916, at
7:30 p. m., or as soon thereafter as
those interested may be heard, at
which time and place the said Super-
visors will sit as a Board of Equaliza-
tion to receive complaints or objec-
tions respecting the method of appor-
tionment, or respecting the proposed
several assessments; and that the
said Corrected Map and Preliminary
Assessment Roll may be seen and
examined at the office of the City and
County Engineer in the McIntyre
Building, at any time during business
hours prior to and including March 28,
1916.
