

### SHRINERS COME AT 11 O'CLOCK FRIDAY MORNING

Committee From Aloha Temple is Leaving Tomorrow for Hilo To Welcome Visitors

Bound for Hilo, where they will take an active part in assisting the Hilo nobles in entertaining Imperial Potentate J. Putnam Stevens and visiting Shriners when they reach Hilo Thursday morning, a group of prominent nobles of Aloha Temple will leave tomorrow morning on the Maiea Kea, headed by Potentate Thomas E. Wall.

The Shriners will not reach Honolulu until 11 o'clock Friday morning, according to Potentate Wall this afternoon, as the Great Northern's sailing time from Hilo has been set for 1 o'clock Friday morning, an hour later than schedule, as an accommodation to the entertainment committee.

A royal welcome will be extended the Imperial Potentate and his delegation. The Arab Patrol of Aloha Temple will be at the dock here to extend them a greeting of true Hawaiian splendor.

### SEES TWO WAYS FOR HONOLULU'S REAL PROGRESS

"As I see the municipal situation, there are only two ways in which Honolulu is going to get anything like efficient government," said C. G. Egan today. "One of these is for such men as E. D. Tenney, E. Faxon Bishop, F. M. Swamy and others to accept city office. They are about the busiest men we have and the busy man is the man who does things. They will be able to settle these problems with which the present board is manifestly unable to cope.

"The second way is for the city to adopt the commission-manager form of government, get a real live business man for city manager, pay him a salary that is commensurate with his brains and cut his office loose from peanut politics. Give him a free hand, and what is very essential, let him run the road department instead of having it run by men who are to get the jobs because they are voters or control voters.

"The present system of electing supervisors is, to my mind, wrong and it has broken down invariably. For the amount of money that is spent here Honolulu is not getting anything like proportionate results."

### ELEVEN VOTERS OF 8TH PRECINCT BAWL OUT BOARD

Eleven good men of the Eighth Precinct Republican Club last night in meeting assembled did condemn, score and "bawl out" the membership of the board of supervisors. There are about 300 Republican voters in the precinct. Fourteen were present.

In a long series of resolutions the board is declared, among other things, to be the choice of the Democratic, not the Republican voters of the city and this fact is supposed to be proven by the statement that it has "ignored the party organization, the party pledges and platform and the welfare of the community in general." By "their incompetence and extravagance" the supervisors have disgraced the Republican party, the resolutions declare, and they are called on to resign in order that better men may be selected and the voters given a chance to see what real Republicans can do for the county.

Lorrin Andrews presided at the meeting. After the adoption of the resolutions a committee was selected to attend tonight's board meeting and protest against the supervisors' action in the Lusitana street improvement project.

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### FERN MAY FIND OPPOSITION IN M. C. PACHECO

Former Supervisor's Friends Talk of Him as Candidate for Mayor

Politics and more politics are boiling up in the local Democratic kettle. The latest is that Chairman M. C. Pacheco of the Democratic territorial central committee may be a candidate for mayor.

Behind the possible candidacy is what the McCordless Bourbons call the defection of Ex-Mayor Fern from their wing. When he filed as a candidate for delegate to the national convention, with their slate already filed, they charged that he went over to the McCarthy-Pinkham wing and were accordingly wroth. Some of them are now planning to "hang it on Joe" in the fall campaign, and they expect to run an opposition man to his mayoralty campaign. Pacheco is one of those suggested for the position.

Pacheco's experience as a member of the board of supervisors, his eight years' presidency of the San Antonio society, and his chairmanship of the municipal charter convention are being urged as qualifications. Also, in the last election he ran far ahead of Fern in votes. He was something like five or six hundred votes ahead, running in a field of 14 supervisory candidates, while Fern was opposing Lane for mayor. Pacheco's friends point to this as proof of his vote-getting ability and say that if he ran against Fern in the primaries this fall the ex-mayor will sustain a second defeat.
