

TRIES TO SAVE SISTER FROM OPIUM HABIT

Something most unusual either on the stage or screen is a female Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde; nevertheless Blanche Sweet appears in just such a character and appears to good advantage in "The Secret Sin" now being presented at the Liberty theater.

The "secret sin" is the use of opium and one of the "twin sisters" portrayed by Miss Sweet is addicted to the drug habit, while the other makes a life-long fight to bring about her reformation. The dual role is of particular interest for the reason that on a number of occasions both characters appear in the same scenes. The cameraman has performed some wonderful, almost magical, work in this production and demonstrates to excellent advantage the effect of "double" and "triple" exposure.

Sussie Hayakawa, the eminent Japanese actor, is seen for the first time in a character part, appearing as Lin Foo, the Chinese keeper of the opium den.

Another popular artist appearing in this offering is Thomas Meighan. He is one of the handsomest men in filmdom and is a finished artist. In "The Secret Sin" Meighan appears as Jack Herron, who works with the stronger twin in her efforts to save her weaker sister.

"The Diamond From the Sky" improves with age and the closing chapters are stronger even than the earlier ones. The great mysteries are gradually becoming unwound, but there is still much that must be explained before the fans will be satisfied.
