## WAR DESOLATION IN PICTURES AT MCCORD MEETING

Last night was picture night at the Hawaiian Opera House, and the building was filled with a large and representative audience. After an illustrated solo sung by Miss Mary Clark of San Francisco, Evangelist McCord spoke briefly on the desolation that marks the pathway of war. Before showing the war pictures a selection was rendered on the harp by Signor De-Nufrio, and the Royal Hawaiian Glee Club sang, which selections were appreciated by all.

The pictures thrown on the screen included great decisive battles of the past as well as scenes from this greatest of wars. From these pictures it could be readily seen how war has developed from the primitive bow and arrow of the past to the giant weapons of warfare used today. Dealing with the present struggle the pictures vividly depicted scenes like the ruins of Rheims Cathedral, the destruction of the beautiful Cloth Hall at Ypres, the desolation that marks the site of once prosperous villages, and farms and houses by the thousands obliterated. Death and destruction on all sides tell the story of the great war better than human speech. The pictures depicted the siege of Liege, and showed the awful havoc caused by the monster guns in the destruction of these apparently impregnable forts. Modern guns have revolutionized the tactics of warfare, and have demonstrated that forts as well as ancient castles have perhaps passed away forever.

From Liege and Namur the series went to the city of Antwerp and the trenches. Among many scenes showing trench life one picture was very noticeable. This was a Christmas picture, and showed the English and German soldiers fraternizing for a few hours. This was a real boys out of the trenches by Christmas picture. Other pictures presented different angles of the war. Zeppelins in the air; super-dreadnoughts on the sea and the submarines are seen doing their deadly work.

These pictures deeply impressed the audience with the reality of war. "The End of the World" will be the topic for tonight. Every seat in the Opera House is free, and all English-speaking people are cordially invited. Everybody is welcome. Salvator S. De-Nufrio, the harp soloist, will play, and the Royal Hawaiian Glee Club will sing again tonight. The song service begins at 7:30.
